AMENDMENT NO. 1

On page 1, in the sponsor line, strike "**Delegate Simpson**" and substitute "**Delegates Simpson**, **Grammer**, and **Conaway**"; in line 2, before "**Penalty**" insert "**Statute of Limitations and**"; in line 3, after the first "of" insert "altering the statute of limitations applicable to a certain offense relating to the prohibition against intercepting and disclosing any wire, oral, or electronic communications and"; in the same line, strike ", as a misdemeanor instead of a felony, a certain" and substitute "the"; strike beginning with "relating" in line 4 down through "communications" in line 5 and substitute "as a misdemeanor instead of a felony"; in line 8, after "Section" insert "5–106(a) and (b) and"; and after line 10, insert:

AMENDMENT NO. 2

On page 1, after line 18, insert:

"<u>5</u>–106.

- (a) Except as provided by this section, § 1–303 of the Environment Article, and § 8–1815 of the Natural Resources Article, a prosecution for a misdemeanor shall be instituted within 1 year after the offense was committed.
 - (b) Notwithstanding § 9–103(a)(3) of the Correctional Services Article or any

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other provision of the Code, if a statute provides that a misdemeanor is punishable by imprisonment in the penitentiary or that a person is subject to this subsection:

- (1) The State may institute a prosecution for the misdemeanor at any time; and
 - (2) For purposes of the Maryland Constitution, the person:
- (i) Shall be deemed to have committed a misdemeanor whose punishment is confinement in the penitentiary; and
- (ii) May reserve a point or question for in banc review as provided under Article IV, § 22 of the Maryland Constitution.
- (JJ) A CRIMINAL PROSECUTION UNDER § 10–402(A) OF THIS ARTICLE SHALL BE INSTITUTED WITHIN 5 YEARS AFTER THE OFFENSE WAS COMMITTED.".
