### AMENDMENTS TO SENATE BILL 3

(First Reading File Bill)

### AMENDMENT NO. 1

On page 1, strike lines 2 and 3 in their entirety and substitute "Workgroup on the Creation of a Data Dashboard for Public Work Contracts and Apprentices – Establishment"; strike beginning with "requiring" in line 4 down through "contracts" in line 11 and substitute "establishing the Workgroup on the Creation of a Data Dashboard for Public Work Contracts and Apprentices to study the most efficient and cost—effective method to create a publicly available data dashboard that disaggregates information regarding public work contracts with the State and apprentices working under the public work contracts; and generally relating to the Workgroup on the Creation of a Data Dashboard for Public Work Contracts and Apprentices"; and strike in their entirety lines 12 through 16, inclusive.

### AMENDMENT NO. 2

On page 1, in line 18, strike "the Laws of Maryland read as follows"; and after line 18, insert:

- "(a) There is a Workgroup on the Creation of a Data Dashboard for Public Work Contracts and Apprentices.
  - (b) The Workgroup consists of the following members:
- (1) three members of the Senate of Maryland, appointed by the President of the Senate;
- (2) three members of the House of Delegates, appointed by the Speaker of the House;

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- (3) the Secretary of Labor, or the Secretary's designee;
- (4) the Commissioner of Labor and Industry, or the Commissioner's designee; and
  - (5) the following members, appointed by the Governor:
- (i) one representative of the Baltimore–DC Building Trades Council, selected by the President of the Council;
- (ii) one representative of the Mid-Atlantic Pipe Trades
  Association;
- (iii) one representative who is an attorney and a member of Steamfitters Union Local 602;
- (iv) one representative of the Associated Builders and Contractors of Maryland (ABC);
- (v) one representative of the Independent Electrical Contractors (IEC) Chesapeake; and
- (vi) one representative of the Maryland Minority Contractors Association (MMCA).
- (c) The President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House shall designate the co-chairs of the Workgroup.
- (d) The Commissioner of Labor and Industry shall provide staff for the Workgroup.
  - (e) A member of the Workgroup:

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- (1) may not receive compensation as a member of the Workgroup; but
- (2) <u>is entitled to reimbursement for expenses under the Standard State</u>

  Travel Regulations, as provided in the State budget.
- (f) At the first meeting of the Workgroup that occurs on or after July 1, 2025, the Workgroup shall vote to adopt a code of conduct providing for the acceptable conduct of Workgroup members.

## (g) The Workgroup shall:

- (1) study the most efficient and cost—effective method to create a publicly available data dashboard that disaggregates information regarding public work contracts with the State, including information on:
- (i) the name of each contractor and subcontractor working under a public work contract;
- (ii) wages, including overtime wages, and benefits paid to each employee of a contractor or subcontractor working under a public work contract;
- (iii) the job classification of each employee employed by a contractor or subcontractor working under a public work contract;
- (iv) apprentices working under each contractor and subcontractor for public works contracts, including:
  - 1. the number of apprentices employed;
  - 2. demographic information for each apprentice;

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- 3. the date each apprentice registered with the Maryland Department of Labor;
  - 4. the trade practiced by each apprentice; and
  - 5. the certification status of each apprentice; and
- (v) <u>each apprenticeship program sponsored by each contractor or subcontractor working under a public work contract; and</u>
  - (2) <u>make recommendations regarding:</u>
    - (i) where the data dashboard shall be located;
- (ii) necessary costs associated with the development and maintenance of the data dashboard; and
- (iii) time frames during which the data dashboard can be developed and implemented and the frequency with which the information in the data dashboard can be updated.
- (h) On or before January 7, 2027, the Workgroup shall report its findings and recommendations to the Governor and, in accordance with § 2-1257 of the State Government Article, the General Assembly.".

On pages 1 through 3, strike in their entirety the lines beginning with line 19 on page 1 through line 14 on page 3, inclusive, and substitute:

"SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2025. It shall remain effective for a period of 1 year and 7 months and, at the end of January 31, 2027, this Act, with no further action required by the General Assembly, shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.".
