AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL 935

(First Reading File Bill)

AMENDMENT NO. 1

On page 1, in line 2, strike "**Public Schools** –"; in line 3, after "**Games**" insert "<u>Requirements</u>"; in line 5, strike "a licensed athletic trainer" and substitute "<u>certain health care professionals</u>"; in the same line, strike "an ambulance" and substitute "<u>an ambulance staffed with certain emergency medical services personnel, except under certain circumstances,"</u>; and in line 10, after "7–451" insert "<u>and 7–452</u>".

AMENDMENT NO. 2

On page 2, strike in their entirety lines 4 through 9, inclusive; in line 10, strike the brackets; in the same line, strike "(V)"; and in line 11, after "section" insert "; AND

(V) FOR HIGH SCHOOL FOOTBALL PROGRAMS ONLY, POLICIES THAT MEET THE REQUIREMENTS OF SUBSECTION (F) OF THIS SECTION".

On page 3, after line 34, insert:

- "(F) (1) THE VENUE-SPECIFIC EMERGENCY ACTION PLAN FOR A HIGH SCHOOL FOOTBALL PROGRAM SHALL INCLUDE DURING A GAME:
- (I) THE PRESENCE OF A VOLUNTEER OR LOCAL SCHOOL SYSTEM EMPLOYEE WHO IS ONE OF THE FOLLOWING TRAINED HEALTH CARE PROFESSIONALS:
- 1. AN ATHLETIC TRAINER LICENSED UNDER TITLE
 14, SUBTITLE 5D OF THE HEALTH OCCUPATIONS ARTICLE;

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- 2. AN INDIVIDUAL LICENSED OR CERTIFIED TO PROVIDE EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 13–516 OF THIS ARTICLE;
- 3. A NURSE, LICENSED UNDER TITLE 8 OF THE HEALTH OCCUPATIONS ARTICLE; OR
- 4. A PHYSICIAN LICENSED UNDER TITLE 14 OF THE HEALTH OCCUPATIONS ARTICLE; OR
- (II) SUBJECT TO PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS SUBSECTION, AN AMBULANCE STAFFED WITH THE APPROPRIATE EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES PERSONNEL.
- (2) THE REQUIREMENTS UNDER PARAGRAPH (1)(II) OF THIS SUBSECTION MAY BE SATISFIED IF AN AMBULANCE WITH THE APPROPRIATE EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES PERSONNEL IS LOCATED WITHIN 3 DRIVING MILES OF THE HIGH SCHOOL FOOTBALL GAME AT A FIRE, RESCUE, OR AMBULANCE FACILITY.
- (3) NOTHING IN THIS SUBSECTION MAY BE CONSTRUED TO PROHIBIT AN AMBULANCE DESCRIBED UNDER PARAGRAPH (1)(II) OF THIS SUBSECTION FROM RESPONDING TO AN EMERGENCY DURING THE COURSE OF A FOOTBALL GAME.

7-452.

(a) (1) Each nonpublic middle school and high school that receives State funding shall develop a venue–specific emergency action plan for all athletic facilities.

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- (2) A venue–specific emergency action plan developed by a nonpublic school shall include:
- (i) The operation and use of automated external defibrillators in a manner consistent with the requirements of § 13–517 of this article;
- (ii) <u>Heat acclimatization in a manner consistent with the model</u> policy developed under § 7–434 of this subtitle;
- (iii) Coordination of care for other emergent injuries, including cervical spinal injury, concussion and closed head injury, major orthopedic injuries, and severe weather for outdoor facilities; [and]
- (iv) A cardiac emergency response plan in accordance with subsection (e) of this section; AND
- (V) FOR HIGH SCHOOL FOOTBALL PROGRAMS ONLY, POLICIES THAT MEET THE REQUIREMENTS OF SUBSECTION (F) OF THIS SECTION.
- (b) A venue—specific emergency action plan developed under this section shall be:
 - (1) Posted at each athletic facility at the school;
- (2) Available on the school's website for viewing by a student athlete's parent or guardian at the beginning of each school year;
 - (3) Distributed to each member of the coaching staff; and
- (4) Rehearsed in person and interactively by all of the coaching staff of each sport before each of their respective seasons.

- (c) The provisions of a venue–specific emergency action plan for the operation and use of automated external defibrillators shall ensure that:
- (1) An automated external defibrillator is provided on—site and is located at or within a brief walk from an athletic practice or event on school property;
- (2) An automated external defibrillator is freely accessible during all school functions;
- (3) All members of the coaching staff are trained in the operation and use of an automated external defibrillator; and
- (4) A trained member of the coaching staff is present at all athletic practices and events on school property.
- (d) The provisions of a venue–specific emergency action plan for heat acclimatization shall:
- (1) <u>Include guidelines for student athletes consistent with the Model</u> <u>Policy for Preseason–Practice Heat Acclimatization Guidelines for Student Athletes</u> established under § 7–434 of this subtitle;
- (2) Ensure that each school is properly prepared and equipped to initiate cold water immersion for the treatment of exertional heat stroke;
- (3) Ensure that the cooling modality is readily available to student athletes at all athletic practices and events on school property;
- (4) Ensure that all members of the coaching staff are trained in cold water immersion; and

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- (5) Ensure that a trained member of the coaching staff is present at all athletic practices and events on school property.
- (e) (1) <u>Each venue</u>—specific emergency action plan shall include a cardiac emergency response plan.
 - (2) The cardiac emergency response plan shall:
- (i) <u>Identify the appropriate school personnel to serve as the cardiac emergency response team who will be tasked with responding to incidents involving an individual experiencing sudden cardiac arrest or a similar life—threatening emergency while at an athletic facility;</u>
- (ii) Coordinate with first responders in the local emergency medical services to integrate the cardiac emergency action plan into local emergency response protocols; and
- (iii) <u>Include, at minimum, the following evidence—based core</u> <u>elements recommended by an appropriate national organization, including the American Heart Association:</u>
- 1. Procedures for activating the cardiac emergency response team during incidents involving an individual experiencing sudden cardiac arrest or a similar life—threatening emergency while at an athletic facility; and
- 2. Requiring specified school personnel to have training in first aid, cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR), and the operation and use of automated external defibrillators, in a manner consistent with § 7–425 of this subtitle, including cardiac emergency response team members, athletic coaching and training staff, school nurses, and any other individuals identified by the cardiac emergency response team.

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- (3) Each year, each middle school and high school shall review and update the cardiac emergency response plan required under this subsection.
- (F) (1) THE VENUE-SPECIFIC EMERGENCY ACTION PLAN FOR A HIGH SCHOOL FOOTBALL PROGRAM SHALL INCLUDE DURING A GAME:
- (I) THE PRESENCE OF A VOLUNTEER OR NONPUBLIC SCHOOL EMPLOYEE WHO IS ONE OF THE FOLLOWING TRAINED HEALTH CARE PROFESSIONALS:
- 1. AN ATHLETIC TRAINER LICENSED UNDER TITLE
 14, SUBTITLE 5D OF THE HEALTH OCCUPATIONS ARTICLE;
- 2. <u>AN INDIVIDUAL LICENSED OR CERTIFIED TO</u>
 PROVIDE EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 13–516 OF
 THIS ARTICLE;
- 3. A NURSE LICENSED UNDER TITLE 8 OF THE HEALTH OCCUPATIONS ARTICLE; OR
- 4. A PHYSICIAN LICENSED UNDER TITLE 14 OF THE HEALTH OCCUPATIONS ARTICLE; OR
- (II) SUBJECT TO PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS SUBSECTION, AN AMBULANCE STAFFED WITH THE APPROPRIATE EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES PERSONNEL.
- (2) THE REQUIREMENTS UNDER PARAGRAPH (1)(II) OF THIS SUBSECTION MAY BE SATISFIED IF AN AMBULANCE WITH THE APPROPRIATE EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES PERSONNEL IS LOCATED WITHIN 3 DRIVING

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MILES OF THE HIGH SCHOOL FOOTBALL GAME AT A FIRE, RESCUE, OR AMBULANCE FACILITY.

(3) NOTHING IN THIS SUBSECTION MAY BE CONSTRUED TO PROHIBIT AN AMBULANCE DESCRIBED UNDER PARAGRAPH (1)(II) OF THIS SUBSECTION FROM RESPONDING TO AN EMERGENCY DURING THE COURSE OF A FOOTBALL GAME."
