AMENDMENT NO. 1

On page 1, in line 3, strike "**Regulations**"; strike beginning with "adopt" in line 6 down through "testimony" in line 9 and substitute "consider, before deciding whether to approve an application and issue a new license permitting the sale of alcoholic beverages for off–premises consumption, the impact of the density of existing retail establishments licensed in the county to sell alcoholic beverages for off–premises consumption on the public health and safety of the community"; in line 13, after "Section" insert "4–210(a) and"; strike in their entirety lines 16 through 20, inclusive; and after line 25, insert:

"BY adding to

Article – Alcoholic Beverages and Cannabis

Section 25–1507

Annotated Code of Maryland

(2024 Replacement Volume)".

AMENDMENT NO. 2

On page 2, after line 3, insert:

"<u>4–210.</u>

- (a) Before deciding whether to approve an application and issue a license, a local licensing board shall consider:
 - (1) the public need and desire for the license;
 - (2) the number and location of existing license holders;

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- (3) the potential effect on existing license holders of the license for which application is made;
- (4) the potential commonality or uniqueness of the services and products to be offered by the business of the applicant;
- (5) the impact of the license for which application is made on the health, safety, and welfare of the community, including issues relating to crime, traffic, parking, or convenience; and
- (6) any other factor that the local licensing board considers necessary."; and strike in their entirety lines 6 through 23, inclusive.

On page 3, in line 20, strike "§ 25-207" and substitute "§ 25-1507"; and after line 20, insert:

"25-1507.

BEFORE DECIDING WHETHER TO APPROVE AN APPLICATION AND ISSUE A NEW LICENSE PERMITTING THE SALE OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES FOR OFF-PREMISES CONSUMPTION, THE BOARD SHALL CONSIDER THE IMPACT OF THE DENSITY OF EXISTING RETAIL ESTABLISHMENTS LICENSED IN THE COUNTY TO SELL ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES FOR OFF-PREMISES CONSUMPTION ON THE PUBLIC HEALTH AND SAFETY OF THE COMMUNITY."
