3 FOR the purpose of altering the penalties for causing the serious physical injury or death
4 of a vulnerable individual as the result of an individual operating a motor vehicle in
5 ~~violation of certain provisions of law~~ a certain manner; including an individual who
6 is lawfully operating or riding a golf cart or a unicycle on a highway, shoulder,
7 crosswalk, or sidewalk as a vulnerable individual; and generally relating to penalties
8 for causing the serious physical injury or death of a vulnerable individual.

14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
15 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

18 (a) In this section, “vulnerable individual” means:

- 4 (ii) Providing emergency services on a highway; or
- 5 (iii) On a sidewalk or footpath;
- 6 (2) An individual who is lawfully riding or leading an animal on a highway,
- 7 shoulder, crosswalk, or sidewalk; or
- 8 (3) An individual who is lawfully operating or riding any of the following
- 9 on a highway, shoulder, crosswalk, or sidewalk:
- 10 (i) A bicycle **OR UNICYCLE**;
- 11 (ii) A farm tractor or farm equipment;
- 12 (iii) A play vehicle;
- 13 (iv) A motor scooter;
- 14 (v) A motorcycle;
- 15 (vi) An animal-drawn vehicle;
- 16 (vii) An EPAMD; ~~or~~
- 17 (viii) A wheelchair; **OR**

- 19 (b) An individual may not cause the serious physical injury or death of a
- 20 vulnerable individual as a result of the individual operating a motor vehicle ~~in~~:
- 21 **(1) IN A NEGLIGENT MANNER; AND**
- 22 **(2) IN** violation of any provision of this title.
- 23 (c) ~~(1) An individual charged with a violation of subsection (b) of this section:~~
- 24 ~~(i) Must appear in court; and~~
- 25 ~~(ii) May not prepay the fine.~~

1 ~~(2)~~ An individual convicted of a violation of subsection (b) of this section is
2 subject to **IMPRISONMENT NOT EXCEEDING 2 MONTHS OR** a fine not exceeding \$2,000
3 **OR BOTH.**

4 (d) In addition to the penalties provided under subsection (c) of this section, the
5 court may order an individual convicted of a violation of subsection (b) of this section to:

6 (1) Participate in a motor vehicle safety course; and

7 (2) Perform up to 150 hours of community service.

8 (e) The Administration shall suspend the driver's license of an individual
9 convicted of a violation of subsection (b) of this section for at least 7 days but not more than
10 6 months.

11 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
12 October 1, 2025.
