- 23 (a) Except as provided in subsection (b) of this section, a person may not disclose 24 any information concerning an applicant for or recipient of social services, child welfare



- services, cash assistance, food stamps, or medical assistance that is directly or indirectly derived from the records, investigations, or communications of the State, a county, or a municipal corporation or a unit of the State, a county, or a municipal corporation or that is acquired in the course of the performance of official duties.
- 5 (b) This section does not prohibit the disclosure of information:
- 6 (1) in accordance with a court order;
- 7 (2) to an officer or employee of any state or local government[,] **OR** the 8 United States, [or a fiduciary institution,] if the officer or employee is entitled to the 9 information in an official capacity and the disclosure is necessary to administer:
- 10 (i) public assistance, medical assistance, social services, or child 11 welfare services programs; or
- 12 (ii) voter registration in accordance with § 3–203 of the Election Law 13 Article; [or]
- 14 (3) to a fiduciary institution that reported suspected financial abuse or 15 financial exploitation, if the fiduciary institution is authorized to request the information 16 under § 1–306(h) of the Financial Institutions Article; **OR**
- 17 (4) RELATING TO ADULT PROTECTIVE SERVICES, TO AN OFFICER OR
 18 EMPLOYEE OF ANY STATE OR LOCAL GOVERNMENT OR THE UNITED STATES IF THE
 19 OFFICER OR EMPLOYEE IS RESPONSIBLE FOR CONDUCTING AN INVESTIGATION IN
 20 AN OFFICIAL CAPACITY AND THE DISCLOSURE IS RELEVANT TO THE INVESTIGATION.
