BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments, Article – Agriculture Section 2–201, 2–202, and 2–203(a) and (c) Annotated Code of Maryland (2016 Replacement Volume and 2024 Supplement) BY adding to Article – Agriculture Section 2–206 Annotated Code of Maryland (2016 Replacement Volume and 2024 Supplement) BY repealing Article – Agriculture Section 2–1001 through 2–1005 and the subtitle "Subtitle 10. Young Farmers Advisory Board" Annotated Code of Maryland

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- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
