Maryland Higher Education Commission – Demographic Data Collection Parental Status

collect and report certain demographic data from students; and generally relating to
public institutions of higher education and demographic data collection.

- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
 - Article Education

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18 (A) (1) THE COMMISSION SHALL COLLECT DATA FROM EACH PUBLIC 19 INSTITUTION OF HIGHER EDUCATION IN THE STATE ON THE PARENTAL STATUS OF

20 STUDENTS ENROLLED IN EACH INSTITUTION.

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1 (2) THE COMMISSION, IN CONSULTATION WITH THE PUBLIC 2 INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER EDUCATION, SHALL DEVELOP QUESTIONS THAT ALLOW 3 EACH STUDENT TO IDENTIFY:

4 (I) WHETHER THE STUDENT IS A PARENT, ACTING AS A 5 PARENT, OR A LEGAL GUARDIAN;

6 (II) THE AGE OF THE CHILDREN FOR WHICH THE STUDENT HAS 7 RESPONSIBILITY; AND

8 (III) THE TYPE OF CAREGIVING RESPONSIBILITIES THE 9 STUDENT PROVIDES, INCLUDING WHETHER THE STUDENT:

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1. IS A SINGLE PARENT; OR

112.SHARESPARENTALRESPONSIBILITIESWITH12SOMEONE IN THE SAME HOUSEHOLD OR A DIFFERENT HOUSEHOLD.

(B) (1) EACH PUBLIC INSTITUTION OF HIGHER EDUCATION SHALL PLACE
 THE QUESTIONS DEVELOPED UNDER SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION ON ONE OR
 MORE FORMS THAT ARE USED BY THE INSTITUTION TO COLLECT DEMOGRAPHIC
 DATA FROM STUDENTS.

17 (2) EACH PUBLIC INSTITUTION OF HIGHER EDUCATION SHALL MAKE 18 THE DATA COLLECTED UNDER PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION AVAILABLE TO 19 THE COMMISSION IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE FORMAT DETERMINED BY THE 20 COMMISSION UNDER SUBSECTION (C) OF THIS SECTION.

21 (C) THE COMMISSION SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS TO CARRY OUT THIS 22 SECTION, INCLUDING:

23(1) ESTABLISHING A COMMON FORMAT AND TIME FRAME FOR THE24COLLECTION AND REPORTING OF THE DATA REQUIRED UNDER THIS SECTION; AND

25(2)A REQUIREMENT THAT THE COLLECTION OF PARENTAL STATUS26DATA BE INCLUDED WITH THE COLLECTION OF OTHER DEMOGRAPHIC DATA.

27 (D) ON OR BEFORE SEPTEMBER 1, 2026, AND EACH SEPTEMBER 1 28 THEREAFTER, THE COMMISSION SHALL SUBMIT A REPORT TO THE SENATE BUDGET 29 AND TAXATION COMMITTEE, THE SENATE COMMITTEE ON EDUCATION, ENERGY, 30 AND THE ENVIRONMENT, AND THE HOUSE APPROPRIATIONS COMMITTEE, IN

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1 ACCORDANCE WITH § 2–1257 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, THAT 2 SUMMARIZES THE DATA COLLECTED BY THE COMMISSION UNDER THIS SECTION.

3 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 4 1, 2025.
