- that a statement of charges be filed against a law enforcement officer, emergency services personnel, AN ADULT PROTECTIVE SERVICES WORKER, A CHILD WELFARE CASEWORKER, or an educator, the State's Attorney shall also make a recommendation as to whether a summons or warrant should issue.

- (d) Notwithstanding any other provision of the Code or the Maryland Rules, a statement of charges for an offense allegedly committed in the course of executing the duties of the law enforcement officer, emergency services personnel, ADULT PROTECTIVE SERVICES WORKER, CHILD WELFARE CASEWORKER, or the educator may not be filed against a law enforcement officer, emergency services personnel, AN ADULT PROTECTIVE SERVICES WORKER, A CHILD WELFARE CASEWORKER, or educator until the State's Attorney has investigated the circumstances of the matter and made recommendations to the District Court Commissioner in accordance with subsection (c) of this section.
- 9 (e) This section may not be construed to preclude the State's Attorney from making a determination that an information should be filed against a law enforcement officer, emergency services personnel, AN ADULT PROTECTIVE SERVICES WORKER, A CHILD WELFARE CASEWORKER, or an educator or that a grand jury should be convened to determine whether an indictment should be filed.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2025.
