A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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Task Force to Study Fiduciary Adjudication in Maryland

- 3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Task Force to Study Fiduciary Adjudication in Maryland to examine and analyze the efficiency, uniformity, and quality of fiduciary 4 $\mathbf{5}$ adjudication in Maryland and make recommendations; and generally relating to the 6 Task Force to Study Fiduciary Adjudication in Maryland.
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8 WHEREAS, In 2022, the Task Force to Study the Maryland Orphans' Courts issued 9 a report identifying certain inefficiencies and other problems with the selection of judges 10 for, and adjudication of matters before, the orphans' courts; and

11 WHEREAS, More recent developments have further illustrated those problems, 12including the lack of uniformity in probate adjudication across Maryland's jurisdictions; 13and

14 WHEREAS, The adjudication of other fiduciary matters, including those relating to trusts and adult guardianships, involve overlapping issues with probate matters and can 1516 be more efficient; and

17WHEREAS, Maryland created the orphans' courts in 1777 in order to assist families with the transmission of wealth on a member's death; and 18

19 WHEREAS, In the ensuing 248 years, methods for holding and transmitting wealth 20have changed significantly, and probate and fiduciary legal issues have become 21substantially more complex; and

22WHEREAS, The General Assembly recognizes the value that a specialized court 23brings to families in times of transition; and

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1 examine the qualifications, training, and methods of selection of judges (1) $\mathbf{2}$ hearing probate and other fiduciary matters in Maryland; 3 (2)examine the jurisdictions of the orphans' courts and circuit courts with respect to fiduciary matters; 4 $\mathbf{5}$ analyze the efficiency of the procedures for adjudicating fiduciary (3)6 matters in the orphans' courts and circuit courts; 7analyze the effect of the different qualifications of orphans' court judges (4)8 and related litigation procedures on the uniform application of justice in Maryland; 9 analyze and compare the laws and practices of other states relating to (5)the adjudication of fiduciary matters, including the selection, gualification, and training of 10 judges hearing those matters; 11 12(6)seek guidance from appropriate witnesses with experience or expertise 13in the area of fiduciary adjudication; 14examine any other research, analysis, or guidance related to the best (7)15practices for adjudicating fiduciary matters; 16offer one or more opportunities for members of the public and other (8)17interested parties to give their opinions on the subjects considered by the Task Force; and 18 make recommendations to improve efficiency, uniformity, and quality (9)19 of fiduciary adjudication in Maryland. 20On or before January 1, 2026, the Task Force shall report its findings and (g) 21recommendations to the Governor and, in accordance with § 2-1257 of the State 22Government Article, the General Assembly. 23SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2025. It shall remain effective for a period of 1 year and, at the end of June 30, 2026, this 2425Act, with no further action required by the General Assembly, shall be abrogated and of no

26 further force and effect.
