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## Pesticides - PFAS Chemicals - Prohibitions

- FOR the purpose of requiring the Department of Agriculture to develop and maintain a list of certain registered pesticides that list PFAS chemicals as an active ingredient on the labeling accompanying the pesticide; prohibiting a person from using, for certain purposes and beginning on certain dates, certain PFAS pesticides; prohibiting, beginning on a certain date, the Department from registering certain PFAS pesticides for sale in the State; and generally relating to pesticides and PFAS chemicals.

- 4 (D) BEGINNING JUNE 1, 2027, THE DEPARTMENT MAY NOT REGISTER A 5 PFAS PESTICIDE FOR SALE IN THE STATE.
- 6 (E) BEGINNING JUNE 1, 2028, A PERSON MAY NOT USE A PFAS PESTICIDE 7 IN THE STATE.
- 8 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 9 October 1, 2025.
