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Pesticides – PFAS Chemicals – Prohibitions

- 3 FOR the purpose of requiring the Department of Agriculture to develop and maintain a list 4 of certain registered pesticides that list PFAS chemicals as an active ingredient on the labeling accompanying the pesticide; prohibiting a person from using, for certain $\mathbf{5}$ 6 purposes and beginning on certain dates, certain PFAS pesticides; prohibiting, 7 beginning on a certain date, the Department from registering certain PFAS 8 pesticides for sale in the State; authorizing the Department and the Maryland Department of Health to list additional PFAS chemicals based on certain new 9 information; and generally relating to pesticides and PFAS chemicals. 10

4 (2) ON OR BEFORE JANUARY 1, 2026 2032, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL:

5 (I) POST THE LIST DEVELOPED UNDER THIS SUBSECTION ON 6 ITS WEBSITE; AND

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(II) **DISTRIBUTE THE LIST TO ALL CERTIFIED APPLICATORS.**

8 (C) (1) BEGINNING JUNE 1, 2026 <u>2032</u>, A PERSON MAY NOT USE A PFAS 9 PESTICIDE LISTED BY THE DEPARTMENT UNDER SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION:

- 10 (I) AT A HEALTH CARE FACILITY;
- 11 (II) AT A SCHOOL;
- 12 (III) AT A DAY CARE OPERATION;
- 13 (IV) FOR RESIDENTIAL LAWN CARE; OR
- 14 (V) FOR COMMERCIAL MOSQUITO SPRAYING OPERATIONS.

15 (2) BEFORE JUNE 1, 2026 <u>2032</u>, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL NOTIFY 16 ALL CERTIFIED APPLICATORS OF THE PROHIBITION IN PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS 17 SUBSECTION.

18 (D) BEGINNING JUNE 1, 2027 2032, THE DEPARTMENT MAY NOT REGISTER 19 A PFAS PESTICIDE FOR SALE IN THE STATE.

20 (E) BEGINNING JUNE 1, 2028 <u>2032</u>, A PERSON MAY NOT USE A PFAS 21 PESTICIDE IN THE STATE.

22(F)THE DEPARTMENT, IN CONSULTATION AND AGREEMENT WITH THE23MARYLAND DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH, MAY LIST ADDITIONAL PFAS CHEMICALS24BASED ON:

25 (1) <u>NEW AND EMERGING HEALTH IMPACT DATA; AND</u>

26 (2) EVOLUTION IN THE NEEDS, USES, AND AVAILABILITY OF 27 <u>ALTERNATIVES.</u>
