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Outdoor Lighting - Guidance and Use of State Funds

- 3 FOR the purpose of requiring the Maryland Green Building Council, on or before a certain 4 date, to update or develop guidance for the purchase of outdoor lighting fixtures in 5 consideration of certain recommendations; prohibiting State funds from being used 6 to install or replace certain permanent outdoor luminaires for lighting unless certain 7 requirements are met; altering the requirements for the use of State funds for the 8 installation or replacement of certain permanent outdoor luminaires for lighting; 9 authorizing the Board of Public Works, or the Board's designee, to waive a 10 requirement for the use of State funds for the installation or replacement of certain 11 permanent outdoor luminaires under certain circumstances; requiring the 12 Department of Transportation to conduct a certain review; and generally relating to 13 outdoor lighting.


