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2 Health Insurance Counties - Cancer Screening for Professional Firefighters Required Coverage
4 (James "Jimmy" Malone Act)

FOR the purpose of requiring certain health insurers, nonprofit health service plans, and health maintenance organizations to provide coverage to professional firefighters for preventive cancer screening in accordance with certain guidelines; prohibiting certain insurers, nonprofit health service plans, and health maintenance organizations from imposing a consument, coinsurance, or deductible requirement on certain coverage of preventive cancer screenings for professional firefighters: requiring counties and municipalities that offer self-insured employee health benefit plans to comply with a certain provision of this Act; requiring the Secretary of Budget and Management to ensure that the State Employee and Retiree Health and Welfare Benefits Program complies with a certain provision of this Act provide to firefighters employed by the county coverage for preventive cancer screenings in accordance with certain guidelines; authorizing a county to satisfy the requirement by providing a certain annual examination or applying for a certain grant; prohibiting counties from imposing a copayment, coinsurance, or deductible requirement on the coverage; requiring the Maryland Health Care Commission to conduct a certain study; and generally relating to health insurance counties and coverage of preventive cancer screenings for professional firefighters.
