#### 1 AN ACT concerning

#### 2 Public Schools – Commemorative Day – Ruby Bridges Walk to School Day

## FOR the purpose of designating a certain date as Ruby Bridges Walk to School Day; requiring each county board of education to develop and implement a program of

- 5 education for Ruby Bridges Walk to School Day; requiring the State Department of
- 6 Education to develop model content for a program of education for Ruby Bridges
- 7 Walk to School Day; and generally relating to Ruby Bridges Walk to School Day.
- 8 BY adding to
- 9 Article Education
- 10 Section 7–136
- 11 Annotated Code of Maryland
- 12 (2022 Replacement Volume and 2024 Supplement)

## SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 15 Article Education
- 16 **7–136.**

# (A) THE PURPOSE OF THIS SECTION IS TO DESIGNATE NOVEMBER 14 EACH YEAR AS "RUBY BRIDGES WALK TO SCHOOL DAY" TO COMMEMORATE RUBY BRIDGES, WHO, ON NOVEMBER 14, 1960, BECAME THE FIRST AFRICAN AMERICAN STUDENT TO INTEGRATE AN ALL-WHITE ELEMENTARY SCHOOL IN NEW ORLEANS, LOUISIANA.



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1 (B) (1) EACH COUNTY BOARD SHALL DEVELOP AND IMPLEMENT A 2 PROGRAM OF EDUCATION FOR RUBY BRIDGES WALK TO SCHOOL DAY TO BE HELD 3 ON OR AROUND NOVEMBER 14 EACH YEAR.

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(2) THE PROGRAM OF EDUCATION MAY INCLUDE:

5 (I) A SYMBOLIC WALK TO SCHOOL, ENCOURAGING STUDENTS 6 TO REFLECT ON THE SIGNIFICANCE OF RUBY BRIDGES'S HISTORIC WALK;

7 (II) INSTRUCTIONAL MATERIALS FOCUSING ON THE HISTORY
8 OF CIVIL RIGHTS, THE IMPACT OF SCHOOL DESEGREGATION, AND THE ONGOING
9 STRUGGLE FOR RACIAL EQUALITY;

10 (III) DISCUSSIONS, ASSEMBLIES, OR PRESENTATIONS THAT 11 HIGHLIGHT RUBY BRIDGES AND THE CIVIL RIGHTS MOVEMENT; AND

12 (IV) INTERACTIVE PROJECTS HIGHLIGHTING THE IMPORTANCE 13 OF DIVERSITY, TOLERANCE, AND JUSTICE, INCLUDING ARTWORK, ESSAYS, OR 14 ARTISTIC PERFORMANCES.

15 (3) IN DEVELOPING A PROGRAM OF EDUCATION IN ACCORDANCE
16 WITH PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION, A COUNTY BOARD OR PUBLIC SCHOOL
17 IS ENCOURAGED TO:

18(I)COLLABORATEWITHPARENTS,COMMUNITY19ORGANIZATIONS, LOCAL LEADERS, AND CIVIL RIGHTS GROUPS; AND

20 (II) PARTNER WITH LOCAL MUSEUMS, LIBRARIES, AND 21 HISTORICAL SOCIETIES TO PROVIDE STUDENTS WITH OPPORTUNITIES TO EXPLORE 22 THE HISTORY OF CIVIL RIGHTS.

23 (C) (1) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL DEVELOP MODEL CONTENT FOR A 24 PROGRAM OF EDUCATION FOR RUBY BRIDGES WALK TO SCHOOL DAY.

25 (2) THE MODEL CONTENT DEVELOPED BY THE DEPARTMENT IN 26 ACCORDANCE WITH PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION:

(I) MAY INCLUDE INSTRUCTIONAL MATERIALS, INCLUDING
 AGE-APPROPRIATE LESSON PLANS, DISCUSSION GUIDES, HISTORICAL DOCUMENTS,
 AND MULTIMEDIA RESOURCES; AND

30(II)SHALL INCLUDE RESOURCES TO ASSIST TEACHERS TO31ENGAGE STUDENTS IN DISCUSSIONS ABOUT CIVIL RIGHTS AND SOCIAL JUSTICE.

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1 (D) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS TO CARRY OUT THIS 2 SECTION.

3 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 4 1, 2025.
