- 1 (A) THE PURPOSE OF THIS SECTION IS TO DESIGNATE NOVEMBER 14 EACH
 2 YEAR AS "RUBY BRIDGES WALK TO SCHOOL DAY" TO COMMEMORATE RUBY
 3 BRIDGES, WHO, ON NOVEMBER 14, 1960, BECAME THE FIRST AFRICAN AMERICAN
 4 STUDENT TO INTEGRATE AN ALL-WHITE ELEMENTARY SCHOOL IN NEW ORLEANS,
 5 LOUISIANA.
- 6 (B) (1) EACH COUNTY BOARD SHALL DEVELOP AND IMPLEMENT A
 7 PROGRAM OF EDUCATION FOR RUBY BRIDGES WALK TO SCHOOL DAY TO BE HELD
 8 ON OR AROUND NOVEMBER 14 EACH YEAR.
- 9 (2) THE PROGRAM OF EDUCATION MAY INCLUDE:
- 10 (I) A SYMBOLIC WALK TO SCHOOL, ENCOURAGING STUDENTS
 11 TO REFLECT ON THE SIGNIFICANCE OF RUBY BRIDGES'S HISTORIC WALK:
- 12 (II) INSTRUCTIONAL MATERIALS FOCUSING ON THE HISTORY
 13 OF CIVIL RIGHTS, THE IMPACT OF SCHOOL DESEGREGATION, AND THE ONGOING
 14 STRUGGLE FOR RACIAL EQUALITY;
- 15 (III) DISCUSSIONS, ASSEMBLIES, OR PRESENTATIONS THAT
 16 HIGHLIGHT RUBY BRIDGES AND THE CIVIL RIGHTS MOVEMENT: AND
- 17 (IV) INTERACTIVE PROJECTS HIGHLIGHTING THE IMPORTANCE
 18 OF DIVERSITY, TOLERANCE, AND JUSTICE, INCLUDING ARTWORK, ESSAYS, OR
 19 ARTISTIC PERFORMANCES.
- 20 (3) In developing a program of education in accordance 21 With Paragraph (1) of this subsection, a county board or public school 22 Is encouraged to:
- 23 (I) COLLABORATE WITH PARENTS, COMMUNITY
 24 ORGANIZATIONS, LOCAL LEADERS, AND CIVIL RIGHTS GROUPS; AND
- 25 (II) PARTNER WITH LOCAL MUSEUMS, LIBRARIES, AND
 26 HISTORICAL SOCIETIES TO PROVIDE STUDENTS WITH OPPORTUNITIES TO EXPLORE
 27 THE HISTORY OF CIVIL RIGHTS.
- 28 (C) (B) (1) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL DEVELOP MODEL CONTENT FOR 29 A PROGRAM OF EDUCATION FOR RUBY BRIDGES WALK TO SCHOOL DAY.
- 30 (2) THE MODEL CONTENT DEVELOPED BY THE DEPARTMENT IN 31 ACCORDANCE WITH PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION:

(I) MAY INCLUDE INSTRUCTIONAL MATERIALS, INCLUDING AGE-APPROPRIATE LESSON PLANS, DISCUSSION GUIDES, HISTORICAL DOCUMENTS, AND MULTIMEDIA RESOURCES; AND
(II) SHALL INCLUDE RESOURCES TO ASSIST TEACHERS TO ENGAGE STUDENTS IN DISCUSSIONS ABOUT CIVIL RIGHTS AND SOCIAL JUSTICE.
(D) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS TO CARRY OUT THIS SECTION.
SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2025 .
