Recreational Equality for Service Members Act

3 FOR the purpose of establishing rules of interpretation related to the uniformed services: altering the rule of interpretation for "veteran"; altering the application of certain 4 5 provisions of law governing natural resources to apply to all uniformed services, 6 rather than only the armed forces; altering the circumstances under which licenses 7 for fishing in tidal waters do not lapse; authorizing active service members, veterans, 8 and vehicles of which an active service member or veteran is an occupant to enter a 9 State park without paying a certain fee; and generally relating to service members and veterans. 10
