- 7 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,

- 9 (a) There is a Maryland Inventory of Cemeteries and Burial Sites Workgroup.
- 10 (b) The Workgroup consists of the following members:
- 11 (1) the Director of the Maryland Historical Trust, or the Director's
- 12 designee;
- 13 (2) the Executive Director of the Maryland Office of Cemetery Oversight,
- 14 or the Executive Director's designee;

- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2025. It shall remain effective for a period of 1 year and, at the end of June 30, 2026, this Act, with no further action required by the General Assembly, shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
