16 17	(a) (1) In this section[, "influence"] THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE MEANINGS INDICATED.
18	(2) "FRAUD" INCLUDES THE USE OF SYNTHETIC MEDIA.

direct or indirect authority to induce action or to change the decision or act of another,

- 1 (c) Except as provided in § 16–1002 of this title, a person who violates this section 2 is guilty of a misdemeanor and on conviction is subject to a fine of not more than \$5,000 or 3 imprisonment for not more than 5 years or both.
- 4 (d) A person who violates this section is subject to § 5–106(b) of the Courts Article.
