18	(a) There is a Class C (fraternal/sororal) organization license.
19 20 21	(b) The Board may issue the license for use by a local unit of a lodge, political organization, or chapter of a nonprofit and nationwide fraternal or service organization that:
22	(1) is composed only of inducted members;
23	(2) was operating in the county before the license application was made;
24 25	(3) has a membership of at least 100 individuals and dues of at least \$5 per year per individual; and
26 27	(4) owns and operates a home or clubhouse that is principally for the use of its members and guests when accompanied by members.

5	[(2)] (II) a member's guest when accompanied by the member.

13	(a) There is a Class C (veterans' organization) license.
14 15	(b) The Board shall issue the license for use by a local unit of a nationwide nonprofit organization or club that:
16 17	(1) is composed only of members who served in the armed forces of the United States in a war in which the United States has been engaged;
18 19	(2) has a charter from a national veterans' organization that was granted before the application for the license was made;
20 21	(3) has a bona fide membership of at least 100 individuals and dues of at least \$5 per year per individual; and
22 23	(4) operates for its members and meets in a clubhouse principally used for its members.
24 25 26	(c) (1) The SUBJECT TO PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS SUBSECTION, THE license authorizes the license holder to sell beer, wine, and liquor at retail at the place described in the license for on–premises consumption, INCLUDING:
27	(I) DURING AN EVENT HELD ON THE LICENSED PREMISES; AND
28 29	(II) TO A MEMBER OF THE VETERANS' ORGANIZATION OR A GUEST OF THE MEMBER.

8 9 10	(2) (1) THE BOARD MAY ISSUE THE PERMIT ONLY TO A HOLDER OF A CLASS C (VETERANS' ORGANIZATION) LICENSE ESTABLISHED UNDER THIS SECTION.
11 12	(II) AN APPLICANT FOR THE PERMIT SHALL COMPLETE THE FORM THAT THE BOARD PROVIDES.
13 14 15	(3) THE PERMIT AUTHORIZES THE HOLDER OF A CLASS C (VETERANS' ORGANIZATION) LICENSE TO SELL ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES THAT ARE ALLOWED UNDER THE LICENSE:
16	(1) DURING AN EVENT HELD ON THE LICENSED PREMISES;
17 18	(II) TO AN INDIVIDUAL ATTENDING THE EVENT, INCLUDING AN INDIVIDUAL WHO IS NOT A MEMBER OF THE VETERANS' ORGANIZATION; AND
19	(III) FOR ON-PREMISES CONSUMPTION.
20	(4) THE ANNUAL PERMIT FEE IS \$100.
