Public Libraries – Automated External Defibrillator Program (Raymono A. Russell Act)

4 FOR the purpose of requiring operators of certain libraries, beginning on a certain date, to $\mathbf{5}$ place an automated external defibrillator in a certain area, maintain the 6 functionality of the automated external defibrillator, and ensure a trained individual 7 is present under certain circumstances; granting certain immunities to libraries and 8 individuals for certain acts or omissions under certain circumstances; altering the 9 definition of "facility" for the purpose of excluding certain libraries from the Public Access Automated External Defibrillator Program; requiring the Maryland 10 11 Department of Health and the Maryland Institute for Emergency Medical Services 12Systems jointly to adopt certain regulations; and generally relating to an automated external defibrillator program for libraries. 13

15 (D) THE MARYLAND DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND THE MARYLAND 16 INSTITUTE FOR EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES SYSTEMS JOINTLY SHALL ADOPT 17 REGULATIONS THAT:

18 (1) ESTABLISH GUIDELINES FOR PERIODIC INSPECTIONS AND 19 ANNUAL MAINTENANCE OF THE AUTOMATED EXTERNAL DEFIBRILLATORS;

29 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, on or before December 1, 30 2026, the Maryland Institute for Emergency Medical Services Systems shall report to the 31 House Economic Matters Committee, in accordance with § 2–1257 of the State Government 32 Article, on:

1 (1) the libraries that registered automated external defibrillators in 2 accordance with regulations adopted under § 23–102.2 of the Education Article, as enacted 3 by Section 1 of this Act; and

4 (2) the number of adverse cardiac events that required the use of an 5 automated external defibrillator experienced in the libraries that registered the automated 6 external defibrillators.

7 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 8 October 1, 2025.
