CHAPTER _____

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Criminal Law – Destroying Funerary Objects and Cemetery Elements – Statute**
3 **of Limitations and Prohibition**

4 FOR the purpose of increasing the statute of limitations for prosecutions relating to
5 destroying funerary objects and other elements of a cemetery to begin at the time
6 local authorities knew or reasonably should have known of the violation; prohibiting
7 a person from willfully destroying, damaging, defacing, or removing landscaping or
8 part of the grounds of a cemetery; and generally relating to the statute of limitations
9 for and prosecution of the crime of destroying funerary objects and other elements of
10 a cemetery.

9 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
10 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

11 **Article – Courts and Judicial Proceedings**

12 5–106.

13 (a) Except as provided by this section, § 1–303 of the Environment Article, and §
14 8–1815 of the Natural Resources Article, a prosecution for a misdemeanor shall be
15 instituted within 1 year after the offense was committed.

16 **(JJ) A PROSECUTION FOR A VIOLATION OF § 10–404(A) OR (B) OF THE**
17 **CRIMINAL LAW ARTICLE RELATING TO THE DESTRUCTION OF FUNERARY OBJECTS**
18 **AND OTHER ELEMENTS OF A CEMETERY SHALL BE INSTITUTED WITHIN 3 YEARS**
19 **AFTER THE LOCAL AUTHORITIES IN FACT KNEW OR REASONABLY SHOULD HAVE**
20 **KNOWN OF THE VIOLATION.**

22 10–404.

23 (a) (1) Subject to the provisions of paragraph (2) of this subsection, a person
24 may not willfully destroy, damage, deface, or remove:

25 (i) an associated funerary object or another structure placed in a
26 cemetery; [or]

27 (ii) a building, wall, fence, railing, or other work, for the use,
28 protection, or ornamentation of a cemetery; **OR**

29 **(III) LANDSCAPING OR PART OF THE GROUNDS OF A CEMETERY.**

30 (2) The provisions of paragraph (1) of this subsection do not prohibit the
31 removal of a funerary object or a building, wall, fence, railing, **LANDSCAPING**, or other
32 object installed for the use, protection, or ornamentation of a cemetery or burial site, for

1 the purpose of repair or replacement, either at the request of or with the permission of heirs
2 or descendants of the deceased or the owner or manager of the cemetery or burial site.

3 (b) (1) Subject to the provisions of paragraph (2) of this subsection, a person
4 may not willfully destroy, damage, or remove a tree, plant, or shrub in a cemetery.

5 (2) The provisions of paragraph (1) of this subsection do not prohibit
6 normal maintenance of a cemetery or burial site, including trimming of trees and shrubs,
7 removal of weeds or noxious growths, grass cutting, or other routine care and maintenance.

8 (d) A person who violates this section is guilty of a misdemeanor and on conviction
9 is subject to:

10 (1) for a violation of subsection (a) of this section, imprisonment not
11 exceeding 5 years or a fine not exceeding \$10,000 or both; and

12 (2) for a violation of subsection (b) or (c) of this section, imprisonment not
13 exceeding 2 years or a fine not exceeding \$500 or both.

14 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
15 October 1, 2025.
