- 1 (2) KNOWINGLY AND WILLFULLY DISMEMBER, DESTROY, REMOVE, OR 2 OTHERWISE OBLITERATE BY ANY MEANS ANY PORTION OF HUMAN REMAINS; OR
- 3 (3) BURY OR OTHERWISE DISPOSE OF A DEAD BODY.
- 4 (B) A PERSON MAY NOT AID OR ABET ANOTHER IN COMMITTING A 5 VIOLATION OF THIS SECTION.
- 6 (C) A PERSON WHO VIOLATES THIS SECTION IS GUILTY OF A FELONY AND 7 ON CONVICTION IS SUBJECT TO IMPRISONMENT NOT EXCEEDING 10 YEARS.
- 8 (D) A SENTENCE IMPOSED UNDER THIS SECTION SHALL BE CONSECUTIVE 9 TO AND NOT CONCURRENT WITH ANY OTHER SENTENCE IMPOSED FOR ANY OTHER 10 CRIME BASED ON THE ACT ESTABLISHING THE VIOLATION OF THIS SECTION.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2025.
