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Vehicle Laws – Licenses, Identification Cards, and Moped Operator's Permits - Notation of Nonapparent Disability (Eric's ID Law)

 $\mathbf{5}$ FOR the purpose of requiring that certain applications for a license, an identification card, 6 or a moped operator's permit allow an applicant to choose to indicate on the 7 document the applicant's nonapparent disability; requiring the Motor Vehicle 8 Administration to ensure that the license, identification card, or moped operator's 9 permit of an applicant who indicates that the applicant has a nonapparent disability includes a certain notation; requiring the Administration to establish certain public 10 outreach efforts on the availability of the notation; prohibiting the Administration 11 12from disclosing certain information to certain entities about an applicant that 13 indicates that the applicant has a nonapparent disability; and generally relating to nonapparent disability notations on licenses, identification cards, and moped 14 15operator's permits.

(F) THE MARYLAND POLICE TRAINING AND STANDARDS COMMISSION, IN
CONSULTATION WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF STATE POLICE AND OTHER
INTERESTED STAKEHOLDERS, SHALL IMMEDIATELY IMPLEMENT TRAINING
CONCERNING INTERACTIONS WITH INDIVIDUALS WHO HAVE A NONAPPARENT
DISABILITY NOTATION ON THEIR LICENSE, IDENTIFICATION CARD, OR MOPED
OPERATOR'S PERMIT.
