- 2 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND.

- 4 (1) shall be implemented beginning with the statewide primary election 5 held in 2026; and
- 6 (2) are not required to be implemented for any special elections that may occur before the statewide primary election held in 2026.
