19 20	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
21	Article - Alcoholic Beverages and Cannabis

23	This title applies only in Baltimore City.
24	<u>12–104.</u>
25 26	(a) To be considered a restaurant, an establishment shall meet the requirements of this section.
27 28	(b) An establishment shall have average daily receipts from the sale of food that are at least 40% of its total daily receipts.
29 30	(c) The Board may not consider as food an ingredient or a garnish used with or mixed with an alcoholic beverage that is prepared and served for on-premises consumption.
31 32	(d) (1) The Board may waive the food requirement specified under subsection (b) of this section for a restaurant:

- 1 <u>(I) owned and operated by a nonprofit organization in the area</u> 2 <u>bounded by South Ellwood Avenue on the west, Bank Street on the north, South Bouldin</u>
- 3 Street on the east, and Fleet Street on the south; OR
- 4 (II) OPERATED IN THE AREA BOUNDED BY SOUTH EDEN STREET
  5 ON THE WEST, BANK STREET ON THE NORTH, SOUTH SPRING STREET ON THE EAST,
  6 AND EASTERN AVENUE ON THE SOUTH.

- 7 (2) For a license that meets the qualifications under paragraph (1) of this
  8 subsection, the Board may approve an expansion of the licensed premises onto a
  9 noncontiguous property with a second separate use permit issued by the City, if the second
  10 separate use permit specifically refers to the alcoholic beverages license at the primary
  11 location.

- 13 (b) If a community association and an applicant for the issuance or renewal of [a 14 Class B, B–D–7, or D] AN alcoholic beverages license have entered into a memorandum of
- 15 understanding that expressly acknowledges the authority of the Board under this article, the
- 16 Board may make the issuance or renewal of the license conditional on the substantial
- 17 <u>compliance of the applicant with the memorandum of understanding.</u>

- 19 (b) (5) For an establishment that is within 300 feet of the nearest point of a place of worship or school, the Board may issue a license in or approve the transfer of a license into the area specified in paragraph (1)(ii)6 of this subsection only if the license holder has received a letter of support from [a] THE place of worship or school that is within the bounded area AND HAS ENTERED INTO A MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING WITH A COMMUNITY ASSOCIATION THAT IS WITHIN THE BOUNDED AREA.

- 26 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That:
- 27 (a) (1) Notwithstanding § 12–1705 of the Alcoholic Beverages and Cannabis Article, a Class B–D–7 license issued for a premises on the 2800 block of O'Donnell Street shall be considered unexpired until the end of July 1, 2024, for the purpose of completing a transfer of ownership at the same location.
- 31 (2) Notwithstanding § 12–1604.1 of the Alcoholic Beverages and Cannabis 32 Article, a holder of a Class D beer and light wine license on the 3200 block of Eastern 33 Avenue may apply to the Board to convert to a Class D beer, wine, and liquor license if the 34 license holder meets each requirement in § 12–1604.1 except for the requirement to 35 maintain average daily receipts from the sale of food that are at least 51% of the total daily 36 receipts.

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- 1 (3) Notwithstanding § 12–2202 of the Alcoholic Beverages and Cannabis 2 Article, a Class B–D–7 license issued for a premises in the 1600 block of Eastern Avenue 3 shall be considered unexpired until the end of July 1, 2025, for the purpose of completing a 4 transfer of ownership and transfer of location to a premises in the 600 block of South 5 Caroline Street.
- 6 (4) (i) Notwithstanding § 12–2202 of the Alcoholic Beverages and Cannabis Article, a Class B license issued for a premises in the 3500 block of Boston Street shall be considered unexpired until the end of July 1, [2025] **2028**, for the purpose of completing a transfer of ownership and a transfer of location to a premises in the 3600 block of Boston Street.
- 11 (ii) If a Class B license transferred to the 3600 block of Boston Street 12 under subparagraph (i) of this paragraph was originally issued as a Class B–D–7 license, 13 the license holder may apply to the Board to convert the Class B license back to a Class 14 B–D–7 license.
- 15 (5) Notwithstanding § 12–2202 of the Alcoholic Beverages and Cannabis 16 Article, a Class B–D–7 license issued for a premises in the 600 block of South Luzerne 17 Avenue shall be considered unexpired until the end of July 1, 2025, for the purpose of being 18 renewed to the current license year by the licensee.
- 19 (b) The Board may not authorize the transfer of a license in ward 24, precinct 5 20 to a person or a location that has received and retained funding awarded under a legislative 21 bond initiative.

#### Chapter 1027 of the Acts of 2024

## SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That:

- (a) (1) Notwithstanding § 12–1705 of the Alcoholic Beverages and Cannabis Article, a Class B–D–7 license issued for a premises on the 2800 block of O'Donnell Street shall be considered unexpired until the end of July 1, 2024, for the purpose of completing a transfer of ownership at the same location.
- 28 (2) Notwithstanding § 12–1604.1 of the Alcoholic Beverages and Cannabis Article, a holder of a Class D beer and light wine license on the 3200 block of Eastern 30 Avenue may apply to the Board to convert to a Class D beer, wine, and liquor license if the license holder meets each requirement in § 12–1604.1 except for the requirement to 32 maintain average daily receipts from the sale of food that are at least 51% of the total daily receipts.
- 34 (3) Notwithstanding § 12–2202 of the Alcoholic Beverages and Cannabis 35 Article, a Class B–D–7 license issued for a premises in the 1600 block of Eastern Avenue 36 shall be considered unexpired until the end of July 1, 2025, for the purpose of completing a

- transfer of ownership and transfer of location to a premises in the 600 block of South Caroline Street.
- 3 (4) (i) Notwithstanding § 12–2202 of the Alcoholic Beverages and Cannabis Article, a Class B license issued for a premises in the 3500 block of Boston Street shall be considered unexpired until the end of July 1, [2025] **2028**, for the purpose of completing a transfer of ownership and a transfer of location to a premises in the 3600 block of Boston Street.
- 8 (ii) If a Class B license transferred to the 3600 block of Boston Street 9 under subparagraph (i) of this paragraph was originally issued as a Class B–D–7 license, 10 the license holder may apply to the Board to convert the Class B license back to a Class 11 B–D–7 license.
- 12 (5) Notwithstanding § 12–2202 of the Alcoholic Beverages and Cannabis 13 Article, a Class B–D–7 license issued for a premises in the 600 block of South Luzerne 14 Avenue shall be considered unexpired until the end of July 1, 2025, for the purpose of being 15 renewed to the current license year by the licensee.
- 16 (b) The Board may not authorize the transfer of a license in ward 24, precinct 5 to a person or a location that has received and retained funding awarded under a legislative 18 bond initiative.

# 19 <u>SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That:</u>

- 20 (a) Notwithstanding § 12–1705 of the Alcoholic Beverages and Cannabis Article,
  21 a Class D 6–day beer, wine, and liquor license issued for a premises on the 200 block of East
  22 Lexington Street shall be considered unexpired until the end of June 30, 2026, for the
  23 purpose of completing a transfer of ownership at the same location, provided the license
  24 holder received a letter of support from the Downtown Partnership of Baltimore.
- 25 (b) (1) Notwithstanding §§ 12–1703 and 12–1705 of the Alcoholic Beverages
  26 and Cannabis Article, five Class B beer, wine, and liquor licenses issued for restaurant
  27 premises at Harborplace and expired between January 1, 2021, and January 1, 2025, shall
  28 be considered unexpired until the end of June 30, 2030, for the purpose of completing a
  29 transfer of ownership at the same location.
- 30 (2) Notwithstanding § 12–1703 of the Alcoholic Beverages and Cannabis 31 Article, the most recent license holder shall retain liability for any unpaid personal property 32 taxes due to Baltimore City or to the State.
- 33 <u>(3)</u> <u>The Board may not:</u>

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- 34 (i) require a Class B beer, wine, and liquor license issued under this subsection:
  - 1. to have a minimum capital investment; or

1	<u>2.</u> to maintain a minimum or maximum seating amount;
2 3	(ii) authorize the transfer of a license issued under this subsection to another location; and
4 5 6	(iii) require the most recent license holder to complete a Transfer Authorization or Affidavit of Compliance to complete a transfer of ownership in accordance with this subsection.
7 8	(4) At the end of June 30, 2030, a Class B beer, wine, and liquor license issued under this subsection shall expire and be nonrenewable.
9 10 11 12	SECTION 2. 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect June 1, 2025. Section 2 of this Act shall remain effective for a period of 5 years and 1 month and, at the end of June 30, 2030, Section 2 of this Act, with no further action required by the General Assembly, shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
