6 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 7 1, 2025. It shall remain effective for a period of 3 years and, at the end of June 30, 2028, 8 this Act, with no further action required by the General Assembly, shall be abrogated and 9 of no further force and effect.
