15	(A) THIS SECTION DOES NOT APPLY TO A RECORD THAT:
16	(1) IS A COURT RECORD; OR
17 18	(2) PERTAINS TO LITIGATION THAT HAS BEEN FINALLY ADJUDICATED OR OTHERWISE SETTLED.

- 1 (1) THE STATE, A STATE AGENCY, OR A POLITICAL SUBDIVISION OF 2 THE STATE IS OR MAY BE A PARTY; OR
- 3 (2) AN OFFICER OR EMPLOYEE OF THE STATE OR A POLITICAL SUBDIVISION OF THE STATE, BECAUSE OF THAT PERSON'S OFFICE OR EMPLOYMENT, 5 IS OR MAY BE A PARTY.
- 6 (C) NOTHING IN THIS SECTION SHALL BE CONSTRUED TO LIMIT ANY RIGHT 7 OR OPPORTUNITY GRANTED BY STATUTE OR COURT RULE FOR A PARTY TO 8 LITIGATION TO RECEIVE DISCOVERY.
- 9 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 10 October 1, 2025.
