4 FOR the purpose of repealing certain limitations on the prospective employees or
5 volunteers of Carroll County for whom the Department of Human Resources of
6 Carroll County may request a criminal history records check; and generally relating
7 to criminal history records checks for prospective employees or volunteers of Carroll
8 County.

9 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,

14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
15 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

16 **Article – Criminal Procedure**

17 10–232.

18 (b) The Department of Human Resources of Carroll County may request from the
19 Central Repository a State and national criminal history records check for a prospective
20 employee or volunteer of Carroll County [who will be assigned to a position that involves:

- 1 (1) inspections;
- 2 (2) approval or denial of a permit, a license, or any other grant of authority;
- 3 (3) work in the offices of the County Commissioners, sheriff, State’s
- 4 Attorney, circuit court, or county attorney;
- 5 (4) collecting or handling money; or
- 6 (5) care or supervision of a minor].

7 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect

8 October 1, 2025.
