BY repealing and reenacting, without amendments, Article – Alcoholic Beverages and Cannabis Section 18-102 Annotated Code of Maryland (2024 Replacement Volume) BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments, Article – Alcoholic Beverages and Cannabis Section 18-1001 Annotated Code of Maryland (2024 Replacement Volume) SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND. That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 1 18-102.2 This title applies only in Charles County. 3 18-1001. 4 (a) There is a Class B-Stadium (baseball stadium) beer, wine, and liquor license. 5 (b) The Board may issue the license to: 6 (1) the owner of a professional team franchise, whether the franchise is a 7 partnership, corporation, or limited liability company; or 8 (2)a private concessionaire that is under contract with the county or a 9 professional baseball team franchise. 10 (c) The license authorizes the license holder to sell beer, wine, and liquor (1)11 on the premises of a baseball stadium owned or operated by the county, EXCLUDING ANY 12 PARKING AREAS, to individuals present at a baseball game or other event held at the 13 stadium. 14 (2)(i) Except as provided in subparagraph (ii) of this paragraph, beer, 15 wine, and liquor shall be served in plastic, [Styrofoam, or] paper, OR OTHER NONGLASS containers on the stadium premises. 16 17 (ii) Beer, wine, and liquor may be served in glass containers in an 18 enclosed stadium dining area in which patrons are seated. 19 (3)A patron[: 20may consume and carry beer [and], wine, AND LIQUOR (i) anywhere on the stadium premises, EXCLUDING ANY PARKING AREAS [; but 2122(ii) 1. may consume liquor only in an enclosed stadium dining 23area or bar; and 242. may not carry liquor out of the enclosed stadium dining 25area or bar]. 26 The license holder may not allow an individual to carry alcoholic **(4)** 27beverages onto or from the licensed premises.
- 28 Except as provided in regulations adopted under subsection (e) of this section, 29 the license holder may sell beer, wine, and liquor during the hours and days as set out for 30 a Class B beer, wine, and liquor license under § 18–2004 of this title.
