1 AN ACT concerning

2 Maryland Commission to Study the Dental Hygienist Shortage – Establishment

FOR the purpose of establishing the Maryland Commission to Study the Dental Hygienist
 Shortage; and generally relating to the Maryland Commission to Study the Dental
 Hygienist Shortage.

6 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, 7 That:

8 (a) There is a Maryland Commission to Study the Dental Hygienist Shortage.

9 (b) The purpose of the Commission is to support the State's efforts to improve the 10 oral health of Marylanders by ensuring the stability and sustainability of the State's dental 11 hygiene workforce.

- 12 (c) The Commission consists of the following members:
- 13 (1) the Secretary of Health, or the Secretary's designee;
- 14 (2) the Secretary of Higher Education, or the Secretary's designee;
- (3) one representative of the University of Maryland School of Dental
 Hygiene, designated by the Dean of the School;
- 17 (4) one representative of the Blueprint for Maryland's Future 18 Accountability and Implementation Board, designated by the Chair of the Board;
- 19 (5) one representative of the Maryland Commission for Women, designated20 by the Chair of the Commission;

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1 A member of the Commission: (g) $\mathbf{2}$ may not receive compensation as a member of the Commission; but (1)3 (2)is entitled to reimbursement for expenses under the Standard State 4 Travel Regulations, as provided in the State budget. (h) The Commission shall: $\mathbf{5}$ 6 assess the dental hygienist shortage in the State and the impact of the (1)7 shortage on oral health in rural, suburban, and urban communities; and 8 study and make recommendations regarding methods to: (2)9 (i) improve the recruitment and retention of dental hygienists in private practice, community health centers, and public health settings at the statewide 10 11 level: 12(ii) develop region-specific recruitment and retention strategies for dental hygienists in rural, suburban, and urban areas of the State; 13expand dental hygiene education opportunities at institutions of 14(iii) higher education; 1516increase retention of dental hygiene students through (iv) 17educational support and wraparound services; and 18 (v)support dental assistants and community health workers in 19 accessing dental hygiene educational opportunities. 20(i) (1)On or before December 1, 2025, the Commission shall submit an interim 21report of its findings and recommendations to the Maryland Department of Health, the 22Maryland Higher Education Commission, and, in accordance with § 2-1257 of the State Government Article, the General Assembly. 2324On or before December 1, 2026, the Commission shall submit a final (2)25report on its findings and recommendations to the Maryland Department of Health, the Maryland Higher Education Commission, and, in accordance with § 2-1257 of the State 2627Government Article, the General Assembly. 28SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2025. It shall remain effective for a period of 2 years and, at the end of June 30, 2027, 2930 this Act, with no further action required by the General Assembly, shall be abrogated and 31of no further force and effect.

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
