A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 Catastrophic Event Account – Transfer of Funds – State Disaster Recovery Fund

- FOR the purpose of authorizing the transfer of funds from the Catastrophic Event Account
 to the State Disaster Recovery Fund under certain circumstances; altering the
 number of days the Legislative Policy Committee has to review and make comments
 before the Governor may transfer certain funds from the Account through budget
 amendment; and generally relating to the transfer of funds from the Catastrophic
 Event Account.

- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

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1 (b) Subject to the provisions of this section, the Account is established to enable 2 the State or a local government to respond without undue delay to a natural disaster or 3 other catastrophic situation, or federal employee financial hardship from a full or partial 4 federal government shutdown due to a lapse in federal appropriations that cannot be taken 5 care of within the resources of existing appropriations.

(c) The Governor may provide an appropriation in the budget bill to the Account.

7 (d) (1) Subject to paragraph (2) of this subsection, after a [15-day] **5-DAY** 8 review and comment period by the Legislative Policy Committee, the Governor may 9 transfer funds by budget amendment from the Account to:

10 **(I)** the expenditure accounts of the appropriate unit of State 11 government or unit of local government; **OR**

12 (II) SUBJECT TO SUBSECTION (E)(2)(II) OF THIS SECTION, THE 13 STATE DISASTER RECOVERY FUND.

14 (2) If the federal government is in a full or partial shutdown due to a lapse 15 in appropriations, after a 2-day review and comment period by the Legislative Policy 16 Committee, the Governor may transfer funds by budget amendment from the Account to 17 the Federal Government Shutdown Employee Assistance Loan Fund established under § 18 7-327 of this subtitle.

19 (e) Funds appropriated to the Catastrophic Event Account:

20 (1) may not be used to offset operating deficiencies in regular programs of
 21 State government; but

(2) (1) may be expended to assist a unit of State government or unit of
 local government in funding costs in connection with a natural disaster, a catastrophic
 situation, or a full or partial federal government shutdown due to a lapse in appropriations;
 AND

26 (II) MAY BE TRANSFERRED TO THE STATE DISASTER 27 RECOVERY FUND IF:

281. THE BALANCE OF THE FUND HAS BEEN DEPLETED29DUE TO USE OR TRANSFER; OR

30 2. THE ESTIMATED COSTS FOR PROVIDING ADEQUATE
 31 DISASTER RELIEF FOR A NATURAL DISASTER OR CATASTROPHIC SITUATION ARE IN
 32 EXCESS OF THE FUND'S BALANCE.

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1 (f) (1) The Account is a continuing, nonlapsing fund which is not subject to § 2 7–302 of this subtitle.

3 (2) The Treasurer shall separately hold, and the Comptroller shall account 4 for, the Account.

5 (3) The Account shall be invested and reinvested in the same manner as 6 other State funds.

7 (4) Any investment earnings shall be subject to \$7-311(d) of this subtitle.

8 (g) Money appropriated to the Account does not revert to the Revenue 9 Stabilization Account.

10 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 11 1, 2025.
