 3 ASSOCIATED WITH INCREASING ADMINISTRATIVE CAPACITY WITHIN THE
 4 COMMUNITY-BASED ORGANIZATION NECESSARY TO PARTICIPATE IN THE
 5 PARTNERSHIP.
- 6 (F) SUBJECT TO OTHER PROVISIONS OF LAW GOVERNING COMMUNITY
 7 BENEFITS AND ON THE AGREEMENT OF THE PARTIES, A NONPROFIT HOSPITAL MAY
 8 PROVIDE FINANCIAL SUPPORT TO A COMMUNITY-BASED ORGANIZATION TO COVER
 9 THE COSTS ASSOCIATED WITH INCREASING ADMINISTRATIVE CAPACITY WITHIN THE
