- FOR the purpose of altering the definition of "community benefit" to include a certain 4 5 community health worker workforce program; authorizing a nonprofit hospital and 6 a community-based organization to establish through a memorandum of 7 understanding a community health worker workforce program to provide a 8 community benefit; establishing requirements for the memorandum 9 understanding; requiring authorizing a partnership that establishes a community 10 health worker workforce program to provide health insurance to certain individuals under certain circumstances; and generally relating to community health worker 11 12 workforce programs.
