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- 20 (a) In this subtitle the following terms have the meanings indicated unless the 21 context of their use requires otherwise.
- 22 (f) (1) "Health care provider" means a hospital, a related institution as defined
- 23 in § 19–301 of the Health General Article, a medical day care center, a hospice care
- 24 program, an assisted living program, a freestanding ambulatory care facility as defined in



- § 19–3B–01 of the Health General Article, a physician, a physician assistant, an osteopath, an optometrist, a chiropractor, a registered or licensed practical nurse, a dentist, a podiatrist, a psychologist, a licensed certified social worker–clinical, AN EMPLOYEE, AGENT, OR CONTRACTOR OF A HOSPITAL WHO IS LICENSED, CERTIFIED, REGISTERED, OR OTHERWISE AUTHORIZED TO RENDER HEALTH CARE SERVICES IN MARYLAND, and a physical therapist, licensed or authorized to provide one or more health care services in Maryland.
- 8 (2) "Health care provider" does not include any nursing institution 9 conducted by and for those who rely upon treatment by spiritual means through prayer 10 alone in accordance with the tenets and practices of a recognized church or religious 11 denomination.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2025.
