- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
  That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

#### **Article – State Finance and Procurement**

16 (A) THERE IS A WORKGROUP ON ARTIFICIAL INTELLIGENCE 17 IMPLEMENTATION.

18 **(B)** THE WORKGROUP CONSISTS OF THE FOLLOWING MEMBERS:

19 (1) TWO MEMBERS OF THE SENATE OF MARYLAND, APPOINTED BY 20 THE PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE;

TWO MEMBERS OF THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES, APPOINTED BY 1 (2)  $\mathbf{2}$ THE SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE; 3 THE ATTORNEY GENERAL, OR THE ATTORNEY GENERAL'S (3) 4 **DESIGNEE;**  $\mathbf{5}$ **CHIEF EXECUTIVE** MARYLAND (4) THE OFFICER OF THE 6 TECHNOLOGY DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION, OR THE CHIEF EXECUTIVE 7 **OFFICER'S DESIGNEE; AND** 8 (5) THE FOLLOWING MEMBERS, APPOINTED BY THE GOVERNOR: 9 **(I)** FOUR FROM THE MARYLAND REPRESENTATIVES 10 **TECHNOLOGY COUNCIL;** 11 **(II)** THREE REPRESENTATIVES FROM THE E-COMMERCE 12**INDUSTRY;** 13 (III) THREE REPRESENTATIVES FROM THE BIOTECHNOLOGY 14**INDUSTRY;** 15**(IV)** THREE REPRESENTATIVES FROM THE REAL ESTATE 16 **COMMUNITY;** 17**(**V**)** THREE REPRESENTATIVES FROM THE HEALTH CARE 18 SECTOR; AND 19 (VI) THREE REPRESENTATIVES FROM THE EDUCATION SECTOR. THE PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE AND THE SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE 20**(C)** JOINTLY SHALL DESIGNATE THE CHAIR OF THE WORKGROUP. 2122**(**D**)** THE DEPARTMENT SHALL PROVIDE STAFF FOR THE WORKGROUP. A MEMBER OF THE WORKGROUP: 23**(E)** 24(1) MAY NOT RECEIVE COMPENSATION AS A MEMBER OF THE 25WORKGROUP; BUT

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26 (2) IS ENTITLED TO REIMBURSEMENT FOR EXPENSES UNDER THE 27 STANDARD STATE TRAVEL REGULATIONS, AS PROVIDED IN THE STATE BUDGET.

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1(F) THE WORKGROUP SHALL MONITOR ISSUES AND MAKE2RECOMMENDATIONS RELATED TO ARTIFICIAL INTELLIGENCE INCLUDING:

3 (1) THE REGULATION OF ARTIFICIAL INTELLIGENCE USED IN 4 DECISIONS THAT SIGNIFICANTLY IMPACT THE LIVELIHOOD AND LIFE 5 OPPORTUNITIES OF INDIVIDUALS IN THE STATE;

6 (2) DEPLOYER AND DEVELOPER OBLIGATIONS RELATED TO LABOR 7 AND EMPLOYMENT AND PROTECTION OF INDIVIDUAL PRIVACY RIGHTS;

- 8 (3) PROTECTION OF CONSUMER RIGHTS;
- 9 (4) CURRENT PRIVATE SECTOR USE OF ARTIFICIAL INTELLIGENCE;

10(5) GENERAL ARTIFICIAL INTELLIGENCE DISCLOSURES FOR ALL11CONSUMERS; AND

12(6) ENFORCEMENT AUTHORITY FOR THE OFFICE OF THE ATTORNEY13GENERAL'S OFFICE OF CONSUMER PROTECTION.

14 (G) ON OR BEFORE JULY 1, 2026, AND EACH YEAR THEREAFTER, THE 15 WORKGROUP SHALL REPORT ITS FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS, IN 16 ACCORDANCE WITH § 2–1257 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, TO THE 17 SENATE FINANCE COMMITTEE AND THE HOUSE ECONOMIC MATTERS COMMITTEE.

18 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July1, 2025.
