## A BILL ENTITLED

- FOR the purpose of altering certain requirements for continuing education required for the
  renewal of a license for real estate brokers, associate real estate brokers, and real
  estate salespersons, including the number of clock hours, course topics, course
  instructors, and course application fees; and generally relating to the Real Estate
  Commission and continuing education requirements.

- 18 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
   19 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 20 Article Business Occupations and Professions
- 21 17–101.
- 22 (a) In this title the following words have the meanings indicated.
- 23 (d) "Commission" means the State Real Estate Commission.

1 (k) "Licensee" means a licensed real estate broker, a licensed associate real estate 2 broker, or a licensed real estate salesperson.

4 (a) (1) To qualify for renewal of a license under this subtitle, a licensee shall 5 complete at least 15 clock hours of continuing education instruction, as provided in 6 subsection (b) of this section, during the preceding 2-year term.

7 (2) For a licensee who provides real estate brokerage services solely in 8 connection with nonresidential real estate, of the clock hours required under paragraph (1) 9 of this subsection, [1.5] 2 clock hours [may] SHALL be satisfied by a course regarding [fair 10 housing laws and regulations or] the federal Americans with Disabilities Act.

11 (3) A licensee holding a license from another state must complete at least 12 the number of clock hours of continuing education instruction required under paragraph 13 (1) of this subsection during each 2-year license term and may substitute clock hours of 14 continuing education instruction earned in another state, if those clock hours:

- 15 (i) are approved as real estate continuing education in that state;16 and
- 17 (ii) meet the distribution requirements of subsection (b)(2) of this 18 section.

19 (4) The Commission shall grant the substitution of clock hours in 20 paragraph (3) of this subsection only if the other state permits the substitution of clock 21 hours of continuing education instruction approved by the Commission for a licensee of this 22 State.

23 (b) (1) The Commission shall approve the form, substance, and, as provided 24 under paragraphs (2) and (3) of this subsection, subject matter of all continuing education 25 courses.

26 (2) For a licensee who has been issued a renewal certificate under § 17–314 27 of this subtitle, the subject matter approved by the Commission shall:

(i) relate to real estate or to a subject matter intended to assist a
licensee in providing real estate brokerage services to the public in a more efficient and
effective manner, provided that the subject matter is related to helping the public buy or
sell real estate;

4 HOUSE BILL 972 1 4. property management and landlord and tenant laws; and  $\mathbf{2}$ at least one 1.5 clock hour course for each of the following topics: (ii) 3 1. professionalism as it relates to the Maryland Code of 4 Ethics, including a discussion relating to conflict resolution and a licensee's duty of respect for the public, peers, and property; and  $\mathbf{5}$ 6 2. real estate financing. 7 (4)The requirement of paragraph (2)(iii) of this subsection does not apply 8 to a licensee who provides real estate brokerage services solely in connection with nonresidential real estate. 9 10 (5)To be acceptable for credit as a continuing education course under this 11 section, the course shall cover 1 or more topics approved by the Commission. 12(c) (1)Continuing education courses may be conducted by: 13(i) the Maryland Association of Realtors or its member boards; the Real Estate Brokers of Baltimore, Inc.; 14(ii) 15(iii) any similar professional association; or 16 an educational institution approved by the Commission. (iv) 17(2)Continuing education courses shall be taught by a qualified instructor who is experienced in the real estate industry AND SELECTED BY THE COURSE 18**PROVIDER**. 19 20(3)The Commission shall adopt regulations that provide for the conduct of continuing education instruction courses by virtual or remote means. 2122(4)To verify the identity of an individual enrolled in a continuing education 23course, the entity that conducts the continuing education course shall require, as a 24condition of participating in the course, that the individual provide: 25for an in-person course, a photo identification; and (i) 26for a virtual or other remote course, a signed affidavit attesting (ii) to the identity of the individual. 2728If feasible, continuing education courses shall be offered at reasonable (d)29intervals in each county and in each major geographic area of the larger counties.

1 (e) Within 14 days after completion of a continuing education course, the entity 2 that conducted the course may submit the course completion information directly to the 3 Commission and the licensee by electronic means.

4 (f) The Commission may waive the requirements of this section for a licensee if 5 the licensee shows good cause for being unable to meet the requirements.

6 (g) The Commission shall require each course provider to pay a continuing 7 education course application fee [of \$25] SET BY THE COMMISSION.
