1 AN ACT concerning

State Retirement and Pension System – Reemployment Earnings Limitations – Maximum Average Final Compensation

- 4 FOR the purpose of clarifying that the maximum average final compensation that certain $\mathbf{5}$ retirees of the State Retirement and Pension System is to be based on the minimum 6 annual salary on the standard State pay scale as of January 1 of the preceding 7 calendar year in order to be exempt from a certain reemployment earnings 8 limitation; adding an average final compensation reemployment exemption for the 9 temporary suspension of a retirement allowance for disability retirees; and generally 10 relating to the maximum average final compensation for exempting reemployment 11 earnings limitations for retirees of the State Retirement and Pension System.

(b) Except as provided in subsection (d) of this section, an individual who is receiving a service retirement allowance or a vested allowance may accept employment with a participating employer on a permanent, temporary, or contractual basis, if:
