- 2 (a) In this section, "carrier" means:
- 3 (1) an insurer; [or]
- 4 (2) a nonprofit health service plan; **OR**
- 5 (3) A HEALTH MAINTENANCE ORGANIZATION.
- 6 (b) A HEALTH INSURANCE POLICY, A LIFE INSURANCE POLICY, AN ANNUITY
 7 CONTRACT, OR A disability insurance policy may not be sold, delivered, or issued for
 8 delivery in the State by a carrier if the policy contains a clause that purports to reserve sole
 9 discretion to the carrier to interpret the terms of the policy or to provide standards of
 10 interpretation or review that are inconsistent with the laws of the State.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall apply to all policies, contracts, and health benefit plans issued, delivered, or renewed in the State on or after January 1, 2026.
- SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2025.
