1 AN ACT concerning

2 State Retirement and Pension System – Administrative Fees – Repeal

- 3 FOR the purpose of requiring the Board of Trustees for the State Retirement and Pension 4 System to certify certain employer contribution rates each fiscal year; requiring the $\mathbf{5}$ employer contribution rates to include recognition of certain administrative and 6 operational expenses; repealing a requirement that certain administrative and 7 operational expenses of the State Retirement and Pension System and the State 8 Retirement Agency be funded by charging each participating employer an 9 administrative fee for each system participant; clarifying that certain payments 10 certified by the Board of Trustees to be paid by local employers in a certain fiscal 11 year shall be paid; requiring the Board of Trustees to fund certain operating 12 expenses of the State Retirement Agency through the accumulation fund; and 13generally relating to the funding of the administrative and operating expenses of the 14 State Retirement and Pension System and the State Retirement Agency.

 for investment management services, including personnel and operational expenses of the
 Investment Division; and

(iii) the amounts as authorized by the Board of Trustees necessary to
implement a closing agreement with the Internal Revenue Service regarding former
members of the Employees' Retirement System or the Teachers' Retirement System who
elected to become members of or participate in those State systems under former Article
73B, §§ 2–206 and 3–206 of the Code.

28 (2) The amounts for the personnel and operational expenses of the 29 Investment Division shall be paid out of the accumulation fund of each State system on a 30 pro rata basis [and may not be paid by participating employers as provided in § 21–316 of 31 this subtitle].

32 (c) Each year the Board of Trustees shall estimate the amount, not exceeding 33 0.22% of active member payroll, retiree benefits, and former member compensation, 34 necessary for the administrative and operational expenses of the Board of Trustees and the 35 State Retirement Agency.

1 (d) (1) Each quarter of the fiscal year the Board of Trustees shall estimate 2 one-fourth of an amount, not exceeding 0.5% of the market value as of the last day of the 3 preceding quarter of invested assets that are externally managed exclusive of assets 4 invested in real estate or alternative investments, necessary to procure and retain 5 investment management services other than external real estate or alternative investment 6 management services.

7 (2) The Board of Trustees is not limited in the amount of investment 8 manager fees that the Board of Trustees may pay as necessary for external real estate or 9 alternative investment management services.

10 (e) (1) The amounts estimated under subsection (c) of this section shall be paid 11 into the expense funds of the several systems during the ensuing year on a pro rata basis 12 according to the total membership of each system.

13 (2) The amounts estimated under subsection (d) of this section shall be paid 14 into the expense funds of the several systems during the ensuing year on a pro rata basis 15 according to the total assets held by each system.

(f) The Board of Trustees may combine the expense funds of the several systemsfor budgetary and administrative efficiency.

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In this section the following words have the meanings indicated.

(2) "Administrative fees" means the actual administrative and operational
expenses incurred by the Board of Trustees and the State Retirement Agency as of June 30
of the second prior fiscal year.

31 (3) "Library" means a library that is established or operates under the 32 Education Article.

33 (4) "Local employer" means a participating employer other than the State.

1 (b) (1) Subject to paragraph (3) of this subsection, for each fiscal year, the 2 State and each local employer shall pay to the Board of Trustees their pro rata shares of 3 the administrative fees.

4 (2) The pro rata share of the administrative fees of the State and of each 5 local employer for each fiscal year shall be based on the number of members of the several 6 systems employed by the State or local employer as of June 30 of the second prior fiscal 7 year compared to the total membership of the several systems as of that date.

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(3) The State shall pay the pro rata share under this section of each library.

9 (4) The administrative fees used to determine the pro rata shares under 10 this subsection may not include costs for the personnel and operational expenses of the 11 Investment Division.

12 (c) As part of its annual budget submission for a fiscal year, the Board of Trustees 13 shall certify to the Secretary of Budget and Management the percentage of the total 14 membership of the several systems that is employed by the State, the libraries, and each 15 local employer as of June 30 of the second prior fiscal year.

16 (d) (1) The Governor shall include in the budget bill an appropriation to the 17 accumulation funds of the State Retirement and Pension System that equals the authorized 18 administrative fees for the fiscal year.

19 (2) The amounts payable by the State under this section with respect to 20 members employed by each State unit shall be charged against the budget of that unit.

(3) The State shall pay its pro rata share of the amount of administrative
fees authorized in the State budget to the Board of Trustees on July 1 of the applicable
fiscal year.

24 (e) (1) On or before October 1 each year, the Board of Trustees shall:

(i) certify to each local employer other than a library the amount
payable by the local employer for the next fiscal year that is equal to the percentage
certified under subsection (c) of this section multiplied by the amount of administrative
fees; and

(ii) notify the Secretary of Budget and Management and the
 Department of Legislative Services of the certifications sent under item (i) of this
 paragraph.

32 (2) On or before October 1, January 1, April 16, and June 1 of the fiscal 33 year immediately following the certification required in paragraph (1) of this subsection, 34 each local employer shall pay to the Board of Trustees 25% of the amount certified to the 35 local employer by the Board of Trustees under paragraph (1) of this subsection.

1 (3) If a local employer does not pay the amounts required under this section 2 within the time required, the local employer is liable for interest on delinquent amounts at 3 a rate of 4% a year until payment.

4 (4) The Secretary of the Board of Trustees may allow a grace period not to 5 exceed 10 calendar days for payment of the amounts certified under this section.

6 (5) On notification by the Secretary of the Board of Trustees that a 7 delinquency exists, the State Comptroller immediately shall exercise the right of setoff 8 against any money due or coming due to that local employer from the State.

9 (f) On receipt of payments under this section, the Board of Trustees shall credit 10 these amounts to the accumulation fund of the appropriate State system.]

AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, notwithstanding Section 1 of this Act, on or before June 1, 2025, each local employer shall pay to the Board of Trustees for the State Retirement and Pension System the amounts certified to be paid by each local employer for fiscal year 2025 to the Board of Trustees in accordance with § 21–316 of the State Personnel and Pensions Article in effect at the time of certification.

AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, for fiscal year 2026, the 17 amounts for the administrative and operational expenses of the Board of Trustees for the 18 State Retirement and Pension System and the State Retirement Agency shall be paid out 19 of the accumulation fund of each State system on a pro rata basis.

SECTION <u>3.</u> <u>4.</u> AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, for fiscal year 2027 <u>and</u> <u>each fiscal year thereafter</u>, the administrative and operational expenses of the Board of Trustees for the State Retirement and Pension System and the State Retirement Agency shall be included in the employer contribution rates certified by the Board of Trustees for the State Retirement and Pension System as provided in Section 1 of this Act.
