1 AN ACT concerning

Maryland Department of Health – Workgroup to Implement Early and Periodic Screening, Diagnostic, and Treatment Requirements

FOR the purpose of requiring the Maryland Department of Health to convene a workgroup
 to implement Early and Periodic Screening, Diagnostic, and Treatment
 requirements; and generally relating to a workgroup to implement Early and
 Periodic Screening, Diagnostic, and Treatment requirements.

8 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, 9 That:

10 (a) The Maryland Department of Health shall convene a workgroup to implement 11 Early and Periodic Screening, Diagnostic, and Treatment requirements.

- 12 (b) The workgroup shall include the following members:
- 13 (1) behavioral health professionals who work with children and families;
- 14 (2) childhood mental health specialists;
- 15 (3) clinicians who work with children and families;
- 16 (4) children with behavioral health issues;
- 17 (5) behavioral health advocates;

18 (6) parents and caregivers with experience navigating the behavioral 19 health system on behalf of children; and
