- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 19Article Business Regulation208–101.
 - 21 (a) In this title the following words have the meanings indicated.
- 22 (b) "Commission" means the Maryland Home Improvement Commission.

"Fund" means the Home Improvement Guaranty Fund. $\mathbf{5}$ (e) 6 "Hearing board" means a home improvement hearing board appointed by the (f) 7 Commission under § 8–313 of this title. 8 (g) (1)"Home improvement" means: 9 the addition to or alteration, conversion, improvement, (i) modernization, remodeling, repair, or replacement of a building or part of a building that 10 is used or designed to be used as a residence or dwelling place or a structure adjacent to 11 12that building; or 13(ii) an improvement to land adjacent to the building. "License" includes: 13(2)14(i) a contractor license; and 15a salesperson license. (ii) "Licensed contractor" means a person who is licensed by the Commission to 16 (j) 17act as a contractor. "Owner" includes a homeowner, tenant, or other person who buys, contracts 18 (k) 19 for, orders, or is entitled to a home improvement. 20(1)"Salesperson" means a person who sells a home improvement. "Salesperson license" means a license issued by the Commission to sell a home 21(m)22improvement. 23"Sell a home improvement" means: (n) 24to negotiate or offer to negotiate a home improvement contract with an (1)25owner; or 26(2)to seek to get a home improvement contract from an owner. 27(0)"Subcontractor" means a person, other than a laborer or supplier of materials, 28who makes an oral or written agreement with: 29(1)a contractor to perform all or part of a home improvement contract; or

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1 (2) another subcontractor to perform all or part of a subcontract to a home 2 improvement contract.

4 (a) Except as otherwise provided in this title, a person must have a contractor 5 license whenever the person acts as a contractor in the State.

6 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 7 October 1, 2025.

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
