 requirement to pay vehicle registration fees; and generally relating to vehicle
 registration fee exemptions.

- 12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
- 13 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 16 (a) The following vehicles are exempt from the registration fees specified in this 17 subtitle:
- 18 (1) A vehicle that is owned and operated by the United States, this State,
 19 or any political subdivision of this State;
- 20 (2) A vehicle that is owned by a volunteer fire company incorporated in this 21 State or by a rescue squad and that is used for fire fighting or ambulance purposes;
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A canteen wagon of a recognized fire buff organization, as certified by

2	(4) A vehicle owned and operated by the Civil Air Patrol;

7 8 9	(7) A motor vehicle and trailer known as the "40–8 box car" that is owned and operated only for social or charitable purposes by any voiture of the Forty and Eight of the American Legion, Department of Maryland;
10	(8) A vehicle owned by, or leased to, and personally used by a veteran who:
$\begin{array}{c} 11 \\ 12 \end{array}$	(i) As designated or classified by the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs, has lost the use of a hand, arm, or leg, or is totally disabled; or
13	(ii) Has a permanent impairment of both eyes so that:

16 17 18	2. There is a field defect in which the peripheral field has contracted to such an extent that the widest diameter of visual field subtends an angular distance no greater than 20 degrees in the better eye;
19 20 21	(9) A vehicle owned and personally used by an individual who is the surviving spouse of a deceased disabled veteran, as defined under § 7–208 of the Tax – Property Article; [and]

26	(III) A SILVER STAR RECIPIENT;
27	(IV) A BRONZE STAR RECIPIENT; OR
