SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article – Education

9.5–404.

(a) The State Board shall adopt rules and regulations for licensing and operating child care centers.

(b) These rules and regulations shall:

(13) Subject to subsection [(c)] (D) of this section, establish probationary employment qualifications for an individual who is applying for the first time to be a child care teacher in a child care center in the State that serves preschool or school–age children who are at least 3 years old.

~~(C) (1) THESE RULES AND REGULATIONS SHALL SET MINIMAL EXPERIENTIAL REQUIREMENTS FOR INDIVIDUALS TO QUALIFY AS A CHILD CARE TEACHER THAT REQUIRE A CHILD CARE TEACHER TO:~~

~~(1) HOLD A HIGH SCHOOL DIPLOMA;~~

~~(2) HOLD A CERTIFICATE OF HIGH SCHOOL EQUIVALENCY;~~

~~(3) HAVE SUCCESSFULLY COMPLETED COURSES FOR CREDIT AT AN ACCREDITED INSTITUTION OF HIGHER EDUCATION THAT ARE APPROVED BY THE STATE BOARD AS SUFFICIENT TO QUALIFY AS A PROSPECTIVE CHILD CARE TEACHER;~~

~~(4) HAVE SUCCESSFULLY BEEN EMPLOYED FOR 2 YEARS IN A POSITION OTHER THAN A CHILD CARE TEACHER FOR A REGISTERED FAMILY CHILD CARE HOME, A REGISTERED LARGE FAMILY CHILD CARE HOME, OR A LICENSED CHILD CARE CENTER; OR~~

~~(5) MEET THE PROBATIONARY EMPLOYMENT QUALIFICATIONS UNDER SUBSECTION (D) OF THIS SECTION~~ PROVIDE A PATHWAY FOR AN INDIVIDUAL WHO IS QUALIFIED TO BE A CHILD CARE TEACHER, BUT LACKS PROOF OF NECESSARY EDUCATIONAL ATTAINMENT, TO ATTEST TO THE QUALIFYING EDUCATIONAL CREDENTIALS HELD BY THE INDIVIDUAL.

(2) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ESTABLISH A PROCESS TO CARRY OUT THIS SUBSECTION.

 2 subsection (b)(13) of this section shall allow an individual to be employed as a child care
 3 teacher during a probationary period if the individual:

4 (i) ~~¶1.¶~~ Is enrolled in approved pre-service training;

5 ~~¶2.¶~~ ~~(H)~~ Successfully completes the required 90 hours of the
 6 approved pre-service training within 6 months after being hired; and

7 ~~¶3.~~ Holds an associate degree or a bachelor's degree in:

8 A. Early childhood education;

9 B. Elementary education;

10 C. Child development;

11 D. Home economics;

12 E. Nursing;

13 F. Social work;

14 G. Special education; or

15 H. A related field approved by the Department; or

6 ~~EARNED A CERTIFICATE OF HIGH SCHOOL EQUIVALENCY.~~

7 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July
8 1, 2025.
