AN ACT concerning
Natural Resources – Vessels – Carbon Monoxide Warning Labels (Matthew's Law)
FOR the purpose of prohibiting a person from operating a gasoline–powered vesses manufactured after a certain date that has accommodation spaces, swim platforms or aft lounging areas on the waters of the State unless the vessel has carbon monoxide warning labels affixed in conspicuous locations in certain areas of the vessel; prohibiting the Department of Natural Resources from imposing a certain penalty; and generally relating to the State Boat Act.

Annotated Code of Maryland (2023 Replacement Volume and 2024 Supplement)
SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
Article - Natural Resources
8–740.2.
(A) A PERSON MAY NOT OPERATE A GASOLINE-POWERED VESSER MANUFACTURED AFTER JULY 31, 2007, THAT HAS ACCOMMODATION SPACES, SWIMPLATFORMS, OR AFT LOUNGING AREAS ON THE WATERS OF THE STATE UNLESS THE VESSEL HAS CARBON MONOXIDE WARNING LABELS AFFIXED IN CONSPICUOUS LOCATIONS IN THE VICINITY OF BOTH THE TRANSOM AND THE HELM OF THE VESSEL (B) THE DEPARTMENT MAY NOT IMPOSE A PENALTY ON A PERSON THAT
VIOLATES THE PROVISIONS OF THIS SECTION.
SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2025.
