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- FOR the purpose of clarifying that certain gambling and betting activities that are offered or conducted online in the State are prohibited, except under certain circumstances; requiring the State Lottery and Gaming Control Commission to report to certain committees of the General Assembly on certain matters related to certain online gaming; and generally relating to online gambling and betting activities.

- 13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
- 14 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

15 Article - Criminal Law

- 17 (a) The Office of the Attorney General, the State Lottery and Gaming Control
- 18 Commission, the Department of State Police, local law enforcement units, and the court
- 19 shall construe liberally this title relating to gambling and betting to prevent the activities
- 20 prohibited.
- 21 (b) GAMBLING AND BETTING ACTIVITIES THAT ARE OFFERED OR
- 22 CONDUCTED ONLINE IN THE STATE ARE PROHIBITED, EXCEPT AS:

1 (1) PROVIDED UNDER TITLE 9, SUBTITLES 1D AND IE OF THE STATE 2 GOVERNMENT ARTICLE; OR

3 (2) AUTHORIZED UNDER THIS ARTICLE.

- 4 **(C)** A decision by the State Lottery and Gaming Control Commission shall be the 5 final determination as to whether a gaming device being operated in the State is:
- 6 (1) a legal gaming device or device consistent with the provisions of this 7 article; and
- 8 (2) being operated in a lawful manner under this article.
- 9 **[(c)] (D)** If a local law enforcement unit fails to promptly enforce a final determination made under subsection **[(b)] (C)** of this section, the State Lottery and Gaming Control Commission shall refer the matter to the Department of State Police for enforcement of the law.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, on or before January 1, 2026, the State Lottery and Gaming Control Commission shall report to the Senate Budget and Taxation Committee and the House Appropriations Committee and Ways and Means Committee, in accordance with § 2–1257 of the State Government Article, on:
- 17 (1) the number of illegal online gaming platforms that can be accessed by 18 State residents;
- 19 (2) the amount of wagers being placed by individuals in the State using 20 illegal online gaming platforms;
- 21 (3) the means by which individuals in the State are able to access illegal 22 online gaming platforms;
- 23 (4) the means by which illegal online gaming operators are marketing to 24 individuals in the State;
- 25 (5) the manner in which individuals in the State are able to place wagers 26 through illegal online gaming platforms; and
- 27 (6) actions that are available to block access to illegal online gaming platforms by individuals in the State, as well as compliance and enforcement measures that the Commission may employ to cease operations of illegal online gaming platforms in the State.
- SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2025.
