24	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
25	That Section(s) 9-233(d) and (e) of Article - Human Services of the Annotated Code of
26	Maryland be renumbered to be Section(s) 9–233(e) and (f), respectively.



SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

3 Article – Human Services

- 5 (a) (1) In this section[, "youth] THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE 6 MEANINGS INDICATED.
- 7 (2) "CRIMINAL REPOSITORY" MEANS THE CRIMINAL JUSTICE 8 INFORMATION SYSTEM CENTRAL REPOSITORY OF THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC 9 SAFETY AND CORRECTIONAL SERVICES.
- 10 **(3) "YOUTH** services bureau" means a community-based entity that is 11 operated:
- [(1)] (I) to provide community-oriented delinquency prevention, youth suicide prevention, drug and alcohol abuse prevention, and youth development;
- [(2)] (II) to ameliorate conditions that contribute to delinquency, youth suicide, drug and alcohol abuse, and family disruption; and
- 16 [(3)] (III) to function as an advocate of youth needs.
- 17 (D) (1) A YOUTH SERVICES BUREAU MAY APPLY TO THE CENTRAL REPOSITORY FOR A STATE AND NATIONAL CRIMINAL HISTORY RECORDS CHECK FOR AN EMPLOYEE, A VOLUNTEER, OR AN INTERN OF THE BUREAU.
- 20 (2) AS PART OF THE APPLICATION FOR A CRIMINAL HISTORY 21 RECORDS CHECK, THE BUREAU SHALL SUBMIT TO THE CENTRAL REPOSITORY:
- 22 (I) A COMPLETE SET OF LEGIBLE FINGERPRINTS TAKEN IN A 23 FORMAT APPROVED BY THE DIRECTOR OF THE FEDERAL BUREAU OF 24 INVESTIGATION;
- 25 (II) THE MANDATORY PROCESSING FEE REQUIRED BY THE 26 FEDERAL BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION FOR A FEDERAL CRIMINAL HISTORY RECORDS CHECK; AND
- 28 (III) THE FEE AUTHORIZED UNDER § 10–221(B)(7) OF THE 29 CRIMINAL PROCEDURE ARTICLE FOR ACCESS TO MARYLAND CRIMINAL HISTORY 30 RECORDS.

1	(3) IN ACCORDANCE WITH §§ 10-201 THROUGH 10-229 OF THE

17	RECORDS CHECK, THE CENTRAL REPOSITORY SHALL PROVIDE TO THE BUREAU AND
18	THE INDIVIDUAL REVISED CRIMINAL HISTORY RECORD INFORMATION.

SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect

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October 1, 2025.
