- 12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND.
- 13 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 14 Article Public Safety
- 15 [14–3A–06.
- A health care provider is immune from civil or criminal liability if the health care
- 17 provider acts in good faith and under a catastrophic health emergency proclamation.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 19 October 1, 2025.
