A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **State Procurement – Prohibited Certifications – Boycotts of Foreign Countries**

3 FOR the purpose of prohibiting a procurement officer from requiring a certain certification
4 from a bidder or offeror or including a certain clause in a State procurement contract
5 or contract renewal relating to boycotts of foreign countries; and generally relating
6 to prohibited certifications and State procurement.

7 BY adding to

8 Article – State Finance and Procurement

9 Section 13–212.2 and 13–228

10 Annotated Code of Maryland

12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
13 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

14 **Article – State Finance and Procurement**

15 **13–212.2.**

16 **A PROCUREMENT OFFICER MAY NOT REQUIRE A BIDDER OR OFFEROR, AS A**
17 **CONDITION TO SUBMITTING A BID OR PROPOSAL ON A STATE PROCUREMENT, TO**
18 **CERTIFY THAT THE BIDDER OR OFFEROR, EXCEPT AS REQUIRED UNDER THIS**
19 **ARTICLE OR UNDER FEDERAL LAW:**

20 **(1) IS NOT ENGAGING IN A BOYCOTT OF A FOREIGN COUNTRY; OR**

21 **(2) WILL REFRAIN FROM A BOYCOTT OF A FOREIGN COUNTRY FOR**
22 **THE DURATION OF THE CONTRACTUAL OBLIGATIONS.**

2 **A PROCUREMENT OFFICER MAY NOT INCLUDE IN A STATE PROCUREMENT**
3 **CONTRACT, OR RENEWAL OF A CONTRACT, A CLAUSE REQUIRING THE CONTRACTOR**
4 **TO CERTIFY THAT THE CONTRACTOR, EXCEPT AS REQUIRED UNDER THIS ARTICLE**
5 **OR UNDER FEDERAL LAW:**

6 **(1) IS NOT ENGAGING IN A BOYCOTT OF A FOREIGN COUNTRY; OR**

7 **(2) WILL REFRAIN FROM A BOYCOTT OF A FOREIGN COUNTRY FOR**
8 **THE DURATION OF THE CONTRACTUAL OBLIGATIONS.**

9 **SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect**
10 **October 1, 2025.**
