A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

Prince George's County - Chesapeake and Atlantic Coastal Bays Critical Area Protection Program - Cutting or Clearing Trees

FOR the purpose of providing that, in Prince George's County, a certain person may not be
held liable for the cutting or clearing of trees in the Chesapeake and Atlantic Coastal
Bays Critical Area under certain circumstances; requiring the Critical Area
Commission for the Chesapeake and Atlantic Coastal Bays to adopt regulations
authorizing a certain person to appeal a certain action; and generally relating to the
cutting or clearing of trees in the Chesapeake and Atlantic Coastal Bays Critical
Area in Prince George's County.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

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Article – Natural Resources

20 8-1815.1.

(a) (1) The provisions of this section are in addition to any other sanction,
 remedy, or penalty provided by law.

23 (2) This section does not apply to any cutting or clearing of trees that is 24 allowed under regulations adopted by the Commission under this subtitle.

1 (b) **[If] SUBJECT TO SUBSECTION (F) OF THIS SECTION, IF** a person cuts or 2 clears or plans to cut or clear trees within the Chesapeake Bay Critical Area or Atlantic 3 Coastal Bays Critical Area in violation of an approved local critical area program or of 4 regulations adopted by the Commission, the chair may bring an action, or the local 5 jurisdiction may bring an action or request that the chair of the Commission refer the 6 matter to the Attorney General to bring an action:

7 (1) To require the person to replant trees where the cutting or clearing 8 occurred in accordance with a plan prepared by the State Forester, a registered professional 9 forester, or a registered landscape architect;

- 10 (2) To restrain the planned violation; or
- 11 (3) For damages:

12 (i) To be assessed by a circuit court in an amount equal to the 13 estimated cost of replanting trees; and

14 (ii) To be paid to the Department by the person found to have 15 violated the provisions of this subsection.

16 (c) If the chair of the Commission has reason to believe that the local jurisdiction 17 is failing to enforce the requirements of subsection (b) of this section, the chair shall refer 18 the matter to the Attorney General as provided under § 8–1815(b) of this subtitle.

19 (d) On the chair of the Commission's referral of an alleged violation under 20 subsection (c) of this section to the Attorney General, the Attorney General may invoke the 21 remedies available to the local jurisdiction under subsection (b) of this section in any court 22 of competent jurisdiction in which the local jurisdiction would be authorized to prosecute 23 or sue.

(e) On the request of a local jurisdiction or the chair of the Commission, the State
Forester, a registered professional forester, or a registered landscape architect may
prepare, oversee, and approve the final implementation of a plan to:

(1) Replant trees in any part of the Chesapeake Bay Critical Area where
trees in the Chesapeake Bay Critical Area are cut or cleared in violation of subsection (b)
of this section; and

30 (2) Replant trees in any part of the Atlantic Coastal Bays Critical Area 31 where trees in the Atlantic Coastal Bays Critical Area are cut or cleared in violation of 32 subsection (b) of this section.

33 (F) (1) THIS SUBSECTION APPLIES ONLY IN PRINCE GEORGE'S COUNTY.

1 (2) A PERSON WHO IN GOOD FAITH PURCHASES PROPERTY IN THE 2 CRITICAL AREA MAY NOT BE HELD LIABLE FOR THE CUTTING OR CLEARING OF 3 TREES BY PREVIOUS OWNERS OR USERS OF THE PROPERTY IN VIOLATION OF 4 SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION.

5 (G) THE COMMISSION SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS AUTHORIZING A 6 PERSON TO APPEAL AN ACTION BROUGHT UNDER THIS SECTION.

7 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 8 October 1, 2025.
